Challenges

- Due to the critical role of certain occupations, state and federal regulations require certification, licensing or continuing education to maintain minimum competency standards.
- High-quality training and continuing education are essential for service providers and employees in the occupations with these requirements.



AgriLife Extension Response

The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service offers numerous educational programs recognized by state and industry accreditation authorities for meeting continuing education and certification requirements. These programs serve thousands of people who render vital community services, enabling them to obtain or keep a job, start a business or stay in business.

Economic Impacts

AgriLife Extension directly supports **80,800 jobs** in Texas, with an estimated annual wage base of **\$1.7 billion** with its workforce-related continuing education and certification programs.

- The federally designated Pesticide Safety Education Program in Texas directly supports 64,154 pesticide applicators in Texas, with a salary and time value of \$1.2 billion.
- The School of Irrigation directly supports over 1,490 jobs in the landscape irrigation industry, with an estimated annual wage base of \$49 million.
- The V. G. Young Institute of County Government directly supports 2,584 county officials, with an annual salary base of \$154.4 million.
- The Onsite Wastewater System
 Management directly supports 42
 maintenance technician jobs, with an estimated annual wage base of \$1.6
 million.
- Food Safety Education Program trains more than 6,200 food service managers and other employees, with a collective annual wage base of \$154 million.

- Job training and continuing education through Beef Quality Assurance trainings, Feedyard Camp and the Feedyard Technician Program support 517 Texas jobs, with an annual wage base of \$9.9 million.
- The Texas Watershed Steward Program directly supports 293 jobs in Texas, with an estimated annual wage base of \$13.4 million.
- The Tax Practitioner Workshops directly support 1,013 jobs, with an estimated annual wage base of \$80 million by delivering continuing education to tax practitioners.
- The Mosquito Abatement
 Program directly supports more than 1,000 jobs, with an estimated annual wage base of \$36.7 million.
- AgriLife Extension continuing education programs for licensed realtors in Texas supports 3,181 real estate jobs with average annual earnings of \$64 million.
