- 106 swine, 33 rabbits, 20 steers, 8 heifers, 16 lambs, and 21 goats were exhibited at the Potter County Junior Livestock Show.
- 18 steers, 6 heifers, 87 barrows, 3 goats, 9 lambs, and 13 gilts were shown at Odessa, Fort Worth, San Angelo, San Antonio, Houston, and Austin from January-March. Potter County had the Reserve Breed Champion Duroc Gilt in San Angelo. Along with Reserve Champion Division 1 Crossbred Barrow in San Antonio. Additionally, numerous steer brands and
- ▶ 3 Junior Potter County 4-H members competed in the Big Fun in D1 District 1 Meats Judging Contest. The team placed 4th overall in the junior category.



Agriculture & Natural Resources:

- The 2025 Ornamental and Turf/Right of Way conference hosted 80 area applicators for professional development.
- Spring Private Applicator courses provide new skills for several area producers.
- 20 new Master Naturalist program interns started the intensive intern training program to make an impact on our environment in the area.



<u>IMPACTS</u>

- Potter County ag. continues to support area producers with updated futures forecasting and emerging animal health issue education.
- ▶ 2025 New Year New You program goals impacted 59 adult walkers and 34 older adults, 12 community worksites and 50 community partners.
- ▶ 698 students experienced the life cycle of a chicken through Potter Co. Egg to Chick—Hatching in the Classroom curriculum enrichment.

Family & Community Health

- ▶ A New Year New You Walk Across Texas Worksite Wellness Event incorporated healthy employee initiatives and engaged 59 walkers from 12 community worksites. Worksites benefited from healthcare economic savings and together walked 10, 762 miles in 8 weeks.
- ▶ 18 engaged in WAT's Cooking program to reinforce WAT goals, increase healthy cooking skills, gain nutrition knowledge & apply recipe demos to enhance active living and chronic disease prevention.
- 37 adults received their food handlers certification and beneficial food safety practices for the preparation and handling of food.
- ▶ Early Childhood Education reached 297 providers and enhanced child development skills by encouraging the adoption of research and evidence-based practices.
- ▶ Health Talk Express empowered and engaged 17 older adults in Go-4-30, Heart Health and Nurtured by Nature lessons and activities to increase their overall health.
