AgriLife Extension personnel have the expertise to provide programs in the areas of:


- Supporting production agriculture

We also offer technical certification and training, teaching thousands of people each year who provide essential services and positive economic results.






WORKFORCE

The total workforce of **1,745** fulltime equivalent positions is made up of **1,370** positions budgeted by the agency and **375** county-funded personnel who work in the county Extension offices. 


