RELEVANCE

Horticulture sciences is a growing industry, with local job growth projected at 30% over the next five years. In Texas, horticulture sciences is the second-largest industry and offers various career opportunities. Consumers spend over \$38 billion yearly on professional landscaping and lawn and tree care services. With the continued growth in the horticulture industry, there is a need to educate residents of Lubbock County and the surrounding area of the local horticulture organizations and opportunities, professional educational settings, and overall information. There is also a need to create awareness of what Extension has to offer in regard to research and education.









RESPONSE

Agent Reid organized program planning meetings with the South Plains Fair administration and was able to solidify a 18,000 sq. ft. building during the 2024 South Plains Fair. This nine day event included youth and adult floral design competitions, daily educational classes, youth and adult plant competitions, local non profit and educational organization booths, youth and adult industry innovations competitions stand alone displays, crops competitions, and food/cooking demonstrations.

RESULTS

160,000 individuals attended the South Plains Horticulture Building during the nine day event. 154 individuals participated in a competition. 96 individuals attended at least one of the eighteen classes offered.

Summary

The value of the South Plains Fair Horticulture Building in Lubbock County is empowering residents with the knowledge and support from local organizations to continue growing in horticulture professionally, at home, and in the kitchen.

Future Programming

The South Plains Fair Horticulture Building will continue into 2025. Future expansion areas include: getting local industry involved, new displays, classes, and demonstrations.
