CHECKING FOR FRESHNESS

It's all about knowing the terminology!

<u>Expiration Date</u>-the last date a food should be eaten or used. <u>Sell By Date</u>-the date that the product should be purchased by for best qualities such as freshness, taste and consistency. It is still edible for a time after this date.

Best if Used By Date-the date for highest quality and best flavor. It does not pertain to safety.

<u>Guaranteed Fresh Date-</u>the date for bakery items (usually) that the product will be at the highest quality. It is edible after this date, but will not be at peak freshness.

<u>Use By Date-</u>the last date for use of the product to be at peak quality. It is not a safety date, except on Infant formula.

Tips:

- Purchase before the date on the product.
- Refrigerate any perishables as soon as possible after purchase.
- Freeze if not able to use within date on packaging.
- Nonperishables like grains, beans and canned goods can be used past their label dates.
