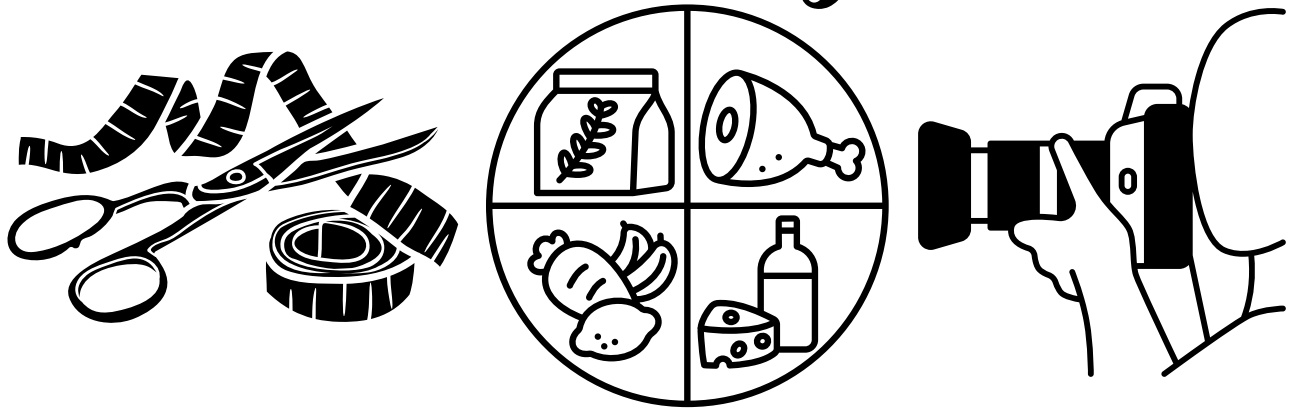

4-H At a Glance

What is 4-H About?

4-H is a community of youth across the United States who are learning leadership, citizenship, and life skills. In 4-H, young people get a chance to have fun by making new friends, developing new skills, and finding new passions.

What do you do in 4-H?

In 4-H, youth "learn by doing" through a wide variety of hands-on learning experiences called 4-H projects. 4-H projects range from basic livestock care to fashion and interior design. Some of these projects can be self-directed or completed in a group setting. With such a wide range of projects, there is truly something for everyone!

What Does a 4-H Club Do?

When enrolling in the 4-H program, you are asked which 4-H county club you would like to join. These clubs are the main way to find out about what is happening in Llano County 4-H!
