



MISSION STATEMENT

1. COMPETITION. Competition is open to the world in all classes, except where otherwise stated in this *Premium List* General Rules & Regulations ("*Premium List*"). Exhibitors are responsible for knowing all the rules, conditions and regulations of Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show (also referred to herein as "Exposition"), including, but not limited to, the rules, conditions and regulations in this *Premium List* and any supplements or amendments thereto which may be issued by Exposition from time to time. In exchange for the opportunity to participate in Exposition's Livestock Show (also referred to as "Stock Show" or "Show") and any experience and/ or other consideration exhibitor receives from same, the receipt and sufficiency of which each exhibitor hereby acknowledges, each exhibitor expressly agrees to be bound by and to comply with all of Exposition's rules, conditions and regulations and to cause its/his/her employees, agents, partners, representatives, guests and anyone under exhibitor's control or acting under exhibitor's direction to comply with such rules, conditions and regulations. Exhibitor shall cause its/his/her employees, agents, representatives, guests, parents/guardians, partners and anyone under exhibitor's control or acting under exhibitor's direction ("exhibitor Parties") to execute an assumption of risk, publicity release and release of liability agreement at Exposition's request. References to Stock Show or Show include the specific event(s) for which Exposition accepted exhibitor's entry application.

If exhibitor is a minor, then exhibitor's legal guardian or parent represents that she/he has the lawful and unrestricted right to agree to Exposition's rules, conditions and regulations, including, without limitation, the releases, licenses and indemnities contained in section 20 of this *Premium List*, on behalf of him/herself and on behalf of the minor and agrees to and is fully bound by such rules, conditions and regulations in both his/her individual capacity and in his/her capacity as parent/legal guardian for exhibitor.

2. APPLICATION FOR ENTRY. All entries must be submitted on entry applications obtained from the office of the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show or from our website fwssr.com and in accordance with instructions on same. These applications, after being signed by the exhibitor, are to be filed in the general office of the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show, PO Box 150, Fort Worth, Texas 76101-0150.

E-mails or telephone calls will not be accepted for the purpose of entry, substitution or cancellation.

3. ENTRY DEADLINES. Entries postmarked by midnight of the above dates will be accepted, if otherwise in order. <u>EXHIBITORS ARE URGED TO MAKE THEIR ENTRIES AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE.</u> This is necessary in order that entries can be shown in the official catalog and stalls can be assigned.

4. ENTRY, STALL, PEN AND GROOMING CHUTE SPACE FEES. The entry and stall fees include the original bedding which will be in the stall upon arrival of livestock. All fees must be enclosed with entries. Overpayments in the amount of \$20 or less will not be refunded. Make checks payable to: Fort Worth Stock Show & Rodeo (FWSSR).

Exhibitors with a specific stall assignment request, must include request with entries.

NOTE: The entry/stall fee or tie out fee does not guarantee the standard stall, pen or tie-out space. In divisions where entries exceed available space, it may be necessary to provide less than one (1) standard stall, pen or tie-out space per animal. Fees will not be refunded under these circumstances.

5. TAXES. Federal law requires the withholding of twenty-four percent (24%) federal income tax from payments made to vendors for which we do not have a taxpayer identification number. This withholding requirement was originally included in the Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982, and generally applies to payments which are required to be reported on Form 1099 to the Internal Revenue Service.

Payees are subject to the backup withholding if the owner does not provide their taxpayer identification number on the requested Form W-9 (as stated in Rule 6) or the number provided is incorrect.

Your premium check will be made payable to the name shown as owner, as indicated on your entry application. Following completion of the Show, agents will be contacted to obtain a Form W-9 for each owner in which the owner's premium check is \$600 or more. The premium check will not be released until a valid, signed Form W-9 is returned to the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show.

SPECIAL NOTE TO ALL EXHIBITORS

You will need:

- One (1) entry application for each single class entry,
- One (1) entry application for each group class entry, and
- One (1) Agent Summary Sheet is needed for the entire group of entries sent in by the Agent, County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher.
- **6. PREMIUMS.** Premiums will be paid as outlined in each department. Premiums offered by the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show will be paid as soon as they can be properly processed after the close of the Exposition.
- 7. RETURNED CHECKS. A \$30 return check fee will be charged for checks returned by the bank for any reason.
- **8. ACCEPTED ENTRIES.** In all cases, the Management reserves the right to reject, accept or conditionally accept any entry and does not guarantee space in the show barns to any entry. It is intended that only such animals shall be entered and shown as have merit and will be a credit to both the exhibitor and this Exposition. An exhibitor who makes a material misrepresentation subjects himself to being barred from all further competition.

ONLY ANIMALS OFFICIALLY ENTERED WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS.

- **9. ERRONEOUS ENTRY.** Exhibits that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to their proper class provided that notification is given to the Livestock Office no later than **December 30, 2024**. No refund will be made on entries canceled by Show Management due to exhibitor exceeding entry limit or same animal entered with two Agents.
- 10. CATALOG NUMBER. Each entry will be assigned a number in the official catalog of the Show. Cattle exhibitors, upon their arrival, will receive from the Department Superintendent, entry numbers to correspond with the catalog numbers. These cards must be displayed by exhibitors when animals are being judged.
- 11. SUBSTITUTIONS. Substitutions of animals will be allowed up to entry closing deadline. Change in ownership is not a substitution but is considered a new entry that will be charged the entry/stall fee provided it is submitted prior to the entry closing deadline. Any substitutions made after this time will be subject to a \$50 substitution charge (cash, money order or check only) and must be within the same Department number and same owner as the original entry (see Rule 26, Page 23, for Ownership of Animals). No entries in group classes may be substituted. Substitutions will be taken between 8 a.m. to Noon in the Stock Show Main Office. All substitutions must be made by Noon the day before judging. The only exception will be Junior Breeding Beef Heifer substitutions (see Rule 8, Page 163). Animals presented to a sifting or inspection committee must be substituted prior to the dates and times outlined in the Special Rules for that department. For information regarding mailing in substitutions, contact the Stock Show Main Office before December 30, 2024.
- 12. CANCELLATIONS/TERMINATIONS/SUSPENSION OR POSTPONEMENT. Stall, pen, entry fees, grounds passes and parking passes will not be refunded to any exhibitor who submits a cancellation after the closing date of entries; cancellations by exhibitors must be submitted in writing prior to the entry closing deadline.

Each exhibitor understands and agrees that Exposition may disqualify an exhibitor from the Show or cancel or disqualify an exhibitor's entry/ies or animals, in whole or in part, at any time and for any reason. Each exhibitor further understands and agrees that Exposition may cancel, terminate, postpone or suspend the Show, in whole or in part, in Exposition's sole discretion at any time and for any reason, with or without notice.

In the event of any such disqualification, cancellation, termination, postponement or suspension, Exposition shall have no obligation, responsibility or liability whatsoever to any exhibitor, exhibitor Party, or any other individual or entity. Without limiting the foregoing, each exhibitor expressly understands and agrees that Exposition shall have no liability, obligation or responsibility to any exhibitor. Party or other individual or entity for any loss of income, premiums or prizes, travel or lodging expenses, storage expenses, costs or expenses related to animals, entry fees or for any other costs, fees, expenses, losses, injuries, damages or liabilities incurred in connection with preparation for or participation in the Show or incurred in connection with, resulting from or arising from any disqualification or cancellation of exhibitor or its/his/her entry/ies or animals or any termination, cancellation, postponement or suspension of the Show in whole or in part at any time and for any reason. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Exposition may, in its sole discretion, refund a prorated portion of the entry fees paid by an exhibitor if the Show is canceled or terminated due to no fault of the exhibitor.

13. GROUNDS PASSES. Complimentary exhibitor grounds passes will be issued to <u>each exhibitor</u> on the schedule listed below, and they will be mailed with the confirmation statement. Additional exhibitor grounds passes may be purchased for \$40 each at the Accounting Office in Cattle 4.

14. PARKING PERMITS. NO FREE PARKING PERMITS WILL BE ISSUED. Each exhibitor may purchase parking permits for \$70 each on the following basis:

- Due to space limitations, vehicles larger than one-ton capacity may be directed by Stock Show Staff to an appropriate parking lot. Recreational vehicles cannot be parked on Stock Show Grounds.
- Justin Garage parking permits are good only for parking in the Justin Garage with overflow parking in the Yellow Lot or Farrington Field. Due to space limitations, parking permit holders may be directed to alternate Stock Show parking lots.
- Pickup trucks with campers may park on Grounds but cannot be used as living quarters.
- PARKING PERMITS MUST BE SECURELY ATTACHED TO THE WINDSHIELD OF VEHICLE. Anyone abusing or transferring these permits will forfeit same.
- PARKING PERMITS DO NOT GUARANTEE A PARKING SPOT.

YELLOW LOT PERMIT HOLDERS - LIVESTOCK

NOTICE: Farrington Field will serve as overflow parking area for holders of Yellow Lot Parking Permits. Due to space limitations, parking permit holders may be directed to alternate Stock Show parking lots.

15. TRAILERS. Parking space will be provided for all trailers. (Refer to Page 262 for Trailer Parking Map.)

Exhibitors with vehicles pulling trailers will be directed to an appropriate location by Stock Show Staff and will remain on Stock Show Grounds at Staff's discretion. However, no trailer, vehicle or vehicle/trailer combination will be allowed on Stock Show Grounds overnight. Any trailer, vehicle or vehicle/trailer combinations left overnight may be towed at owner's expense. No Overnight Camping on the Stock Show Grounds.

- Exhibitors needing information on trailer or vehicle/trailer combination parking should inquire with Stock Show Staff for assistance. Exhibitor will be directed to an appropriate location for parking.
- Trailers cannot be unhooked from vehicles and left on Stock Show Grounds (must be moved to appropriate trailer parking location as directed by Stock Show Staff).
- . Any trailer unhooked from vehicle within the Show Grounds will be towed at owner's expense.

NOTICE

Exhibitors are prohibited from bringing any all-terrain vehicle, golf cart, scooter or any similar device deemed by Stock Show Officials to be unacceptable on the Stock Show Grounds. Any such device found on the Grounds will be immediately impounded and removed at owner's expense.

- 16. REISSUED PASSES. CAUTION: Please take care of grounds passes and parking permits and bring them with you to the Show. Grounds passes and parking permits can be reissued/repurchased at face value if items are lost.
- 17. PASS AND PERMIT REFUNDS. No refund will be made for passes or permits mailed and not returned when cancellations are made prior to cancellation date.

EXHIBITION RULES

- 18. INTERPRETATION AND VIOLATION OF RULES. Exposition reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules, conditions and regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or incident to, Exposition or the Show; and the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations at any time and for any reason as its judgment may determine. All decisions of Exposition shall be final and binding. An exhibitor who violates any of Exposition's rules or regulations will forfeit all sale proceeds, premiums and prizes and will be subject to such penalty as Exposition may order. If an exhibitor Party violates any of Exposition's rules or regulations, exhibitor may forfeit all sale proceeds, premiums and prizes in Exposition's sole discretion, and exhibitor will be subject to such penalty as Exposition may order.
- **19. SPECIAL RULES.** Special Rules or conditions are published in each department where necessary. If there is a conflict between the Special Rules of any department and the General Rules and Regulations, the Special Rules will govern.
- **20. HEALTH, SAFETY, LIABILITY AND PUBLICITY RELEASE.** Exhibitor agrees, and exhibitor agrees to cause all exhibitor Parties, to comply with all health and safety guidelines and recommendations set forth by Exposition, the owners or operators of the premises, arenas, pens, coops, stalls, grounds, facilities and amenities associated with the Show (**"Facilities"**), and/or government or health

officials. These guidelines may include (but are not limited to) wearing face masks or coverings, additional cleaning measures, physical distancing, and hand washing and sanitization. Exhibitor will be responsible for providing all personal protective equipment for exhibitor and the exhibitor Parties in compliance with the foregoing health and safety guidelines and recommendations. Exhibitor understands and agrees that the Facilities and the Show may pose potential risks, including, without limitation, risks to exhibitor's and exhibitor Parties' health, safety, and well-being that do not exist in the ordinary property or activities, including, without limitation, exposure to erratic and unpredictable animal behavior and exposure to crowds and other individuals. Exhibitor further acknowledges that the Show and Facilities are generally dangerous activities and places by their inherent nature and that participation in the Show and being present at the Facilities exposes exhibitor and exhibitor Parties to substantial and serious hazards and risks of property damage or loss, personal injury, permanent disability and/or death.

Exhibitor acknowledges and agrees that exhibitor and the exhibitor Parties will be exposed to crowds, individuals and animals in connection with the Show and while at, on or around the Facilities. As a result, exhibitor acknowledges that exposure to animals, crowds and individuals may result in exhibitor's and/or exhibitor Parties' exposure to or contraction of contagious diseases and viruses, including, without limitation, the novel coronavirus (also known as COVID-19) or any viruses, illnesses or diseases spread by humans or animals. COVID-19 has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization, is extremely contagious, and is believed to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. As a result, federal, state, and local governments and federal and state health agencies recommend social distancing. Exhibitor hereby agrees that exhibitor and exhibitor Parties: (i) will not travel internationally or to or from an area in the United States that has been highly-impacted by COVID-19 within 14 days of the date of entering the Facilities or during the Show; (ii) will not participate in the Show or otherwise enter the Facilities if they have experienced symptoms recognized by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as symptoms of COVID-19 or any other contagious disease or virus within 14 days of entering the Facilities or during the Show; (iii) will not enter the Facilities if diagnosed with, or exposed to a person with a confirmed or suspected case of, COVID-19 or any other contagious virus or disease unless they have subsequently tested negative for the virus or disease and are cleared by a medical doctor for participating in the Show or otherwise being exposed to other people.

Exhibitor understands that the risk of exposure to or infection with COVID-19 or any other contagious disease or virus exists even if Exposition, the owners and operators of the Facilities, and exhibitor and exhibitor Parties take precautions. Exhibitor will not bring sick animals or animals that have been exposed to sick animals or humans to the Facilities. If, at any time, Exposition or exhibitor becomes aware that exhibitor, its animals or an exhibitor Party is a threat to public health or safety, exhibitor shall require that individual or animal to immediately vacate the Facilities.

EXHIBITOR ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THERE MAY BE RISKS NOT KNOWN TO EXHIBITOR OR REASONABLY FORESEABLE AT THIS TIME. EXHIBITOR UNDERSTANDS AND HAS CONSIDERED THE RISKS INVOLVED WITH THE SHOW AND THE FACILITIES AND THE FACT THAT EXHIBITOR MAY NOT BE AWARE OF ALL OF THE RISKS INVOLVED, AND EXHIBITOR VOLUNTARILY AND FREELY CHOOSES TO ASSUME ALL RISKS INVOLVED WITH THE SHOW AND THE FACILITIES (WHETHER KNOWN OR UNKNOWN) ON BEHALF OF EXHIBITOR AND ALL OTHER RELEASORS (DEFINED BELOW).

Exhibitor, on behalf of exhibitor and his/her/its heirs, dependents, assigns, next of kin, agents, successors, assigns, related entities, partners, employees, officers, directors, contractors, representatives in any capacity, and exhibitor Parties (together with exhibitor, "Releasors"), hereby assumes any and all risks associated with, arising from, or involved with exhibitor's presence and activities on or around the Facilities, exhibitor's exposure to crowds, other individuals and animals, and exhibitor's participation in the Show, including, without limitation, any risk of personal or bodily injury or sickness or illness, permanent disability or death to exhibitor or exhibitor's animals or any risk of loss or damage to exhibitor's property or income. Exhibitor also acknowledges and understands the following notices:

WARNING:

UNDER TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 87, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE), A FARM ANIMAL PROFESSIONAL IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT IN FARM ANIMAL ACTIVITIES RESULTING FROM THE INHERENT RISKS OF FARM ANIMAL ACTIVITIES.

WARNING:

UNDER TEXAS LAW (CHAPTER 87, CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE), A LIVESTOCK SHOW SPONSOR IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO, OR THE DEATH OF, A PARTICIPANT IN A LIVESTOCK SHOW RESULTING FROM THE INHERENT RISKS OF LIVESTOCK SHOW ACTIVITIES.

Each exhibitor, on behalf of exhibitor and the other Releasors, hereby WAIVES all rights and claims for damages, losses, costs, injuries, expenses and/or liabilities and does hereby agree to RELEASE, DISCHARGE, HOLD HARMLESS and unconditionally INDEMNIFY the Exposition, Event Facilities Fort Worth, Inc., Multipurpose Arena Fort Worth, the City of Fort Worth (Texas), Rural Media Group and its affiliated networks and radio stations, and any other person or entity that participates, operates, owns, organizes, sanctions, produces, broadcasts, officiates, sponsors, or is otherwise involved in or with the Show or the Facilities, and their respective related entities, advertising agencies, licensee and any other person or entity acting with or under one of the foregoing parties' authority or permission,

and the successors and assigns of any of the foregoing (all of the foregoing with Exposition, the "Released Parties") from and against all liabilities, costs (including, without limitation, attorneys' fees, costs of investigation and court costs), injuries, losses, expenses, claims, lawsuits, demands, actions, proceedings and damages (all of the foregoing, "Claims") that exhibitor, an exhibitor Party or any Released Party may at any time suffer or sustain or become liable for regardless of the legal theory, whether now known or hereafter known, in any jurisdiction throughout the world, EVEN IF SUCH CLAIMS ARE CAUSED BY, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, THE ALLEGED OR ACTUAL SOLE, CONTRIBUTORY OR CONCURRENT NEGLIGENCE OR GROSS NEGLIGENCE OF ANY RELEASED PARTY OR ANY OTHER PERSON OR BASED ON STRICT LIABILITY OR PREMISES LIABILITY, including, without limitation, Claims arising out of or related to (a) the Show and any rules, regulations and conditions of Exposition, (b) any termination, cancellation, suspension or postponement of the Show (or any part thereof) at any time and for any reason, (c) any use or non-use of the Materials (defined below) or exhibitor's Likeness (defined below) by the Released Parties, (d) any act or omission of the exhibitor, exhibitor Parties, the Released Parties, or anyone else, or (e) any accidents, damages, injuries, illnesses, sicknesses, disabilities, deaths, losses or incidents either to the person or property, or both, of exhibitor, any exhibitor Party, any Released Party or of any other individual or entity in any manner arising from any part of the Show or exhibitor's, any exhibitor Party's, any Released Party's, or any other person's acts or omissions or presence at the Facilities, including (without limitation) Claims allegedly or actually arising from (i) any interpretation or violation of rules, (ii) the disqualification of any animal or exhibitor, (iii) the loss of any sales proceeds, income, premium or prize, (iv) travel, storage, boarding or lodging costs or expenses, (v) COVID-19 or any other contagious disease or virus, (vi) the condition of the Facilities or any activities in or around the Facilities, and/or (vii) any alleged failure to provide adequate security. EXHIBITOR, ON BEHALF OF HIS/HER/ITSELF AND THE OTHER RELEASORS, FURTHER AGREES AND COVENANTS NOT TO ASSERT, MAKE OR BRING ANY SUCH CLAIMS AGAINST, OR IN ANY WAY SEEK SUCH CLAIMS FROM, ANY RELEASED PARTY, AND EXHIBITOR FOREVER RELEASES AND DISCHARGES THE RELEASED PARTIES FROM ALL SUCH CLAIMS, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY CLAIMS FOR OR RELATED TO PERSONAL OR MENTAL INJURY, ILLNESS, SICKNESS, PERMANENT DISABILITY, DEATH, LOSS (ECONOMIC OR OTHERWISE), OR PROPERTY DAMAGE OR LOSS OR LOSS OF INCOME, PREMIUMS OR PRIZES.

Further, exhibitor grants the Released Parties' permission to photograph, video, record and interview exhibitor and the nonexclusive, irrevocable, perpetual, sublicensable (through multiple tiers), transferable and worldwide right and license to display, distribute, perform, exhibit, transmit, broadcast, reproduce, publish, digitize, edit, adapt, synchronize, create derivative works from, exploit, stream, license and otherwise use exhibitor's name, nickname, image, likeness, appearance, voice, statements, biographical information, signature, performance, animal statistics and information, trademarks, indicators of source and any other identifying personal characteristics (collectively, "exhibitor's Likeness") and all images, footage, text, photographs, videos, content and materials created by or on behalf of the Released Parties that incorporate or otherwise include, in whole or in part, the exhibitor's Likeness (collectively, the "Materials"); exhibitor agrees that all of the foregoing rights may be exercised by the Released Parties and their designees for any purpose, including, without limitation, educational, entertainment, business and promotional purposes, in perpetuity in any medium or format whatsoever now existing or hereafter created, including, without limitation, in, on, or through print media, film, television, internet and online media, and all forms of broadcast and streaming technologies. The Released Parties shall not be required to obtain any further consent or pay any further consideration to exhibitor or anyone else in exchange for the licenses or the exercise of the rights granted hereunder. Credit or other acknowledgment of exhibitor, if any, shall be determined by the Released Parties in their sole discretion. Exhibitor (i) agrees that the Released Parties make no representation that exhibitor's Likeness will or will not be used in any way, (ii) waives any right to inspect or approve the Materials or any use of the Materials, (iii) agrees that the Released Parties shall have full exclusive ownership (including, without limitation, all copyrights and other intellectual property rights) of any Materials, (iv) represents and warrants that exhibitor is not a member of any union or guild or memberships that would prevent him/her from granting these rights or participating in the Show, and (v) agrees not to challenge or otherwise interfere with the Released Parties' rights in and to the Materials or the Released Parties' use of exhibitor's Likeness.

Each exhibitor (and if applicable, exhibitor's parent/legal guardian) further agrees to execute any writings or other documents which evidence exhibitor's understanding of, and agreement to, the foregoing releases, licenses and indemnities. Exhibitor acknowledges that this section 20 will be construed and interpreted as broadly as possible under Texas law; **EXHIBITOR WAIVES ANY AND ALL GENERAL RELEASE LIMITATIONS PROVIDED BY APPLICABLE LAW OR ANY RIGHTS GRANTED TO HIM/HER THEREUNDER.** If any provision of this section 20 is held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, in lieu of such invalid or unenforceable provision there shall be added a provision which is as similar in terms as possible to such invalid or unenforceable provision and which is

valid and enforceable; such invalid or unenforceable provision shall not affect any other provision of this section 20, and, as so modified, this section 20 shall remain in full force and effect.

21. PROTESTS. Each protest must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$50, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Management of the Exposition immediately after the occasion for such protest. Any protest as to the eligibility on account of age or breeding of animals must be filed with the Management prior to the day on which they are to be judged.

Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed.

- 22. OBJECTIONABLE EXHIBITS. Exhibition Management reserves the right to remove from the Grounds any exhibit, animal, stand or show that may be falsely entered, or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable, without assigning a reason therefore, and, if necessary in Exposition's sole discretion, return any money already paid for space or stalls which shall exonerate the Exposition from any liabilities, damages, losses, costs, expenses, suits, actions, injuries, demands, proceedings and claims whatsoever on the part of the exhibitor or purchaser.
- 23. CONFLICTS. Nothing shall be sold or given away or otherwise disposed of by exhibitors which will in any way conflict with, or which is subject matter of, any privilege or concession granted or sold by the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show.

No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter upon the Grounds, except from his place of business or exhibit space. The tacking or posting of any advertisement, bills, etc., other than within the space occupied by exhibits, is strictly prohibited. The distribution of handbills, flyers and heralds will not under any circumstance be permitted. Begging, soliciting, singing or public speaking are prohibited.

EXHIBITOR'S RULES

- **24. COOKING.** Cooking is not allowed on the Show Grounds at any time other than by food concessionaires. No cookers, crock-pots, microwaves, coffee pots, warmers or other cooking utensils will be permitted.
- 25. REGISTRATION AND CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION. EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE THEIR ORIGINAL REGISTRATION PAPERS AND CERTIFICATES OF VETERINARY INSPECTION AVAILABLE WITH THEIR EXHIBITS AT ALL TIMES DURING THE SHOW. Photocopies or facsimiles will not be accepted, unless specified by the association.
- **26. OWNERSHIP OF ANIMALS.** To be eligible for competition, whether singly or in groups, animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, as reflected on the animal's registration certificate, and all animals entered for competition in the open breeding classes must be entered in the name of the owner and must have been owned by the owner prior to entry closing date. If proof of ownership is required, an affidavit must be furnished

Jointly-owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes. In the group classes, jointly-owned animals may be entered and exhibited under the name of one (1) of the co-owners provided he owns a full or part-interest in each of the animals in the group entry.

For ownership of animals entered for competition in the Junior Show, see Special Rules (Rule 12, Page 144).

- 27. FIRMS AND PARTNERSHIPS. Firms and partnerships entering animals for competition must be in existence at the time of making entry and, in all cases, must be bona fide. Affidavits of the age of the firms may be required by the Management. In all cases, a firm or partnership is considered an exhibitor.
- **28. BREEDER DEFINED.** The breeder of an animal is the owner of the dam at the time of service and shall be so considered in all cases which require animals to be bred by exhibitors. When a breeder, prior to close of entries, disposes of his herd to a corporation wherein he is a stockholder or manager, the animals may be exhibited as bred by said corporation.
- 29. ELIGIBILITY OF ANIMALS. All animals in breeding classes must be purebred, unless otherwise stated, and must be recorded or accepted for record in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds. An animal is eligible to enter and/or compete in only one (1) breed classification regardless if the animal is registered to two (2) or more breed associations or registries. The animal must be registered in the recognized U.S. registry for that breed classification or, if registered in country of origin other than the U.S., said animal must be eligible for registry in the recognized U.S. registry. Exhibitors must produce original certificates of registry at the request of the Superintendent in charge any time during the Exposition. The exhibitor must give, on his application for entry, the breed, class number, date of birth, registration number and names under which the animal is registered in the record association; otherwise, entry will not be accepted. Also, to be eligible, animals must bear a legible tattoo, firebrand or freeze brand number as required by the respective breed association.

- **30. LIMITATION ON OPEN SHOW ENTRIES.** No exhibitor shall be permitted to enter more than two (2) animals or two (2) groups of animals in any one (1) class (excluding the Open Dairy Goat and Boer Goat Shows). However, an exhibitor may enter a third animal in only one (1) individual class for the sole purpose of qualifying and entering the get-of-sire class. (Third animal is not eligible for premium money.)
- 31. GROUP OF ANIMALS. Animals to compose a competitive group need not be named in application of entry. Exhibitors must indicate, on separate entry applications, each group class in which they expect to compete and number of groups to be entered in each class so full information may be shown in official entry catalog. Animals entered in group classes must show as individuals in single classes. There is no charge for group class entries. Cow/Calf classes: Entries in the Cow/Calf classes require that two (2) stall fees be submitted. Dams entered in Cow/Calf classes are ineligible to compete in any other class. ENTRIES IN GROUP CLASSES MUST BE MADE ON A SEPARATE ENTRY APPLICATION AND SUBMITTED BY THE ENTRY CLOSING DEADLINE.
- 32. NURSE COWS. Nurse cows will NOT be permitted on the Show Grounds.
- **33. BARREN ANIMALS.** No barren animals will be eligible in the breeding classes. An affidavit that the animal is a breeder must be furnished upon request.
- **34. DISEASED ANIMALS BARRED.** Efforts will be taken to ensure no animals having a disease of any character will be admitted into the Show Grounds at any time, and the Livestock Show Director, Horse Show Director, General Manager or President are authorized to refuse unloading privileges or remove any stock on the facility having a disease or undesirable ailment as determined by the official Stock Show Veterinarian or the Texas Animal Health Commission.
- **35. CARE OF ANIMALS.** All owners of property or livestock, or others having same in charge, shall care for, guard, protect and preserve the same, as the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show does not undertake to do so, and it shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to said property or the owners thereof.
- **36. BEDDING.** All pens and stalls will be initially bedded with wood shavings upon arrival with the exception of Junior Barrow Show. Dairy cattle will be bedded on straw. Additional wood shavings or straw will be available at the Feed Office. **NOTE: No straw will be allowed in any of the barns except for dairy cattle.**
- **37. DOGS.** Service animals in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) or similar Texas statutes are allowed on the Stock Show Grounds. Pets and dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under ADA and are not allowed on the Stock Show Grounds including Stock Show parking lots.


ADA defines service animals as dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. Texas statutes define an assistance animal as one that is specifically trained or equipped to help a person with a disability.

Service animals can accompany people with disabilities in all areas of the Stock Show Grounds where the public is normally allowed to go. A person with a service animal may be asked to remove the service animal from the premises if: 1) the dog is out of control and the handler does not take effective action to control it; or 2) the dog is not housebroken. Any Stock Show visitor who is asked to remove a dog or pet from the Grounds will be able to participate in, and enjoy Stock Show offerings without the animal's presence.

This rule does not apply to official entries in the Texas Sheep Dog Association Trials or Stock Show specialty acts.

38. CARE OF STALLS AND PENS. All stalls, pens and exhibition spaces must be cleaned before 8 a.m. each day and refuse matter must be disposed of as the Livestock Show Director may direct. No heat lamps, tarps or overhead coverings may be used in the stalling/tie out areas.

An exhibitor will not be permitted to place any bedrolls, buckets, chairs, feed boxes, feed or equipment boxes in the main alleys or in the barn aisles.



ANY EQUIPMENT BROUGHT IN TO BE USED IN STALL OR SPACE MUST COMPLY WITH AND USED IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL FEDERAL, STATE AND MUNICIPAL OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH REGULATIONS.

ANY EXHIBITOR FOUND TO BE HEATING AEROSOL SPRAY CANS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED AND RELEASED FROM THE SHOW.

All decorations used in or about the livestock facilities, such as cloth bunting or banners, crepe paper and cellulose materials, MUST BE FLAMEPROOF, subject to approval of the City of Fort Worth Fire Department.

39. GROOMING CHUTE SPACE. Grooming chute space will be available on a limited basis for a fee of \$40 per space. The space must be reserved and paid for at the time of entry. Stickers will be issued and must be placed on the upper, right hand corner at the back of the chute. Any exhibitor violating this rule will forfeit any prizes or premium money won. Any apparatus used for a grooming chute must be used in the stall and completely off concrete aisles.

Junior Exhibitor Grooming Chute/Scale Permit - See Junior Show Rule 9, Page 144.

NOTICE

Fort Worth Fire Prevention Code Prohibits:
LIQUID OR GAS-FIRED HEATERS IN LIVESTOCK BARNS
In all enclosed structural areas, no liquefied petroleum-fueled or flammable or combustible liquid-fueled heating or other devices will be allowed.

Electricity will be available. All 110-volt electrical outlets will be of the three-wire type.

NOTICE LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

One duplex electrical outlet is provided per two cattle ties. Outlets should not be loaded over 2,000 watts. All extension cords must be UL listed, factory molded (not repaired or altered) and have a maximum length of 25 feet and a minimum gauge size of 12.

Exceeding the 2,000 watts will result in an overload.

40. TIE OUTS. Tie Outs must be reserved and paid for at the time of entry. Tie Outs will be numbered and assigned (see note on Rule 4, Page 18). **TIE OUT TIME IS 7:30 P.M**.

All cattle must be in their assigned stalls between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.

41. SIGNS. In Show barns, livestock exhibitors are permitted to display a sign over each exhibit advertising their own herds. Exhibitors in pen area, having livestock for sale, may display one (1) sign to each exhibit, showing the name of firm or individual to whom shipment was consigned. Signs are to be a maximum of 22 x 36 inches. All other forms of signs or advertising must be approved by the Management, which reserves the right to have objectionable signs removed. Commercial signs, such as feeds, minerals, stock medicines, etc., will not be permitted anywhere on livestock exhibits.

NO CABLE HALTERS.

NO LARGE ROUND OR SQUARE BALES OF STRAW OR HAY WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS.

CREDIT CARDS ARE NOT ACCEPTED FOR ANY ENTRY RELATED FEE.

COOKING IS NOT ALLOWED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS EXCEPT BY FOOD CONCESSIONAIRES.

No cookers, crock-pots, microwaves, coffee pots, warmers or other cooking appliances/utensils will be permitted.

42. ARRIVAL. No animal may arrive before 8 a.m., Friday, January 17. Animals must arrive and be in place during the times set forth below.

- **44. CLASS VERIFICATION.** See Special Rules in each department. No animals shall be changed from one class to another after entry closing date unless it is ineligible for the class in which it is entered. To be eligible for a group class, the animal must be entered and shown in a single class.
- **45. SIFTING COMMITTEE.** The Management will appoint sifting committees to inspect fitness and breed classification purity of animals for show competition. Animals, in the judgment of the sifting committee, lacking competitive exhibition merit or breed classification purity, will become ineligible for competition and may be ordered by the sifting committee from exhibition buildings to a division provided for such animals or from exhibition grounds.

OR ANY OTHER MATERIALS THAT DEFACE TIE-WALLS OR ANY PROPERTY ON THE EXPOSITION GROUNDS.

Exhibitors violating this policy will be invoiced for all costs associated with repairs and will be subject to disqualification from the Show.

Exhibitors will remove blankets from animals at inspection. Animals judged unworthy of exhibition will be removed by exhibitors immediately.

- **47. SHOWING.** Any animal or animals properly entered in any show class and passed upon by the sifting committee is eligible for competition and must be brought into arena for exhibition, unless the reason for their nonappearance in the ring is acceptable to the Superintendent in charge. All single breeding cattle and steers for exhibition must be shown with halter.
- **48. COMMUNICATION DEVICES.** No portable communication devices (i.e., cell phones, radios, tablets, smart watches, fitness trackers, etc.) may be used by exhibitors during competition in show arenas. Exhibitors using such devices will be automatically disqualified.
- **49. REFUSAL TO PARADE.** Exhibitors refusing, for any cause not meeting with the approval of the Management, to lead out their animals for parade or for competition in the show ring when called by the Superintendent in charge, will not only forfeit any prizes previously won but may be barred from further participation in the Show and required to remove their stock from the Show Grounds within six (6) hours after such refusal.
- **50. USING ANIMALS IN JUDGING CONTESTS.** When an exhibitor is called upon to furnish one (1) or more animals for the students to judge in Livestock Judging Contests, they are expected to do so. Refusing to allow their animals to be used in this manner for any cause not meeting with the approval of the Management will forfeit any prizes they may win and be barred from further participation in the Show. Animals to be used in Livestock Judging Contests will be selected through the Department Superintendents and, insofar as possible, will be obtained from those who wish to cooperate with the contests in this manner.
- **51. PHOTOGRAPHS OF CHAMPIONS.** Exhibitors must allow the Management to photograph Champion and Grand Champion winners. These photographs will become the property of the Exposition and will be used for publicity and illustrations in publications.

JUDGE'S RULES

Judges are earnestly requested to familiarize themselves with all the Rules and Regulations of this Show and to especially note those rules bearing on the classes to be judged by them.

- **52. SELECTION OF JUDGES.** Judges will be selected by the Exposition in cooperation with the breed associations. In every case, the judge is selected with the utmost care and, as far as possible, will be of national reputation.
- **53. DECISION OF JUDGES FINAL.** The decision of the judges will be final in all cases, except where mistake, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of award, is proven. In such cases, the Management or such referee as it may appoint may make the decision, or the case may be referred to the Executive Committee from whose decision there can be no appeal.
- **54. INTERFERENCE WITH JUDGES.** If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by agent, or servants, interferes with the judges, or shows any disrespect to them, or the Show, the Management may demand a proper apology from such exhibitor, or it may exclude them from competition and from the ring and may also withhold from such exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded.
- **55. TIME OF JUDGING.** The Livestock Judging schedule as published in this *Premium List* will be followed as closely as possible. Exhibitors should ascertain at what time the exhibits entered will be judged. Any exhibit not presented promptly at scheduled time will be ruled out and barred from competition in the class called. No complaint or protest on the grounds that the judges overlooked exhibits will be considered.

56. METHOD OF AWARDING. No animal will be awarded a prize unless removed from its stall or pen and exhibited, with an entry number (when applicable), before the judge in the show ring, except animals judged in pens.

The Management reserves the right to return entries and cancel any class in which, in its judgment, the number of entries is insufficient to insure adequate competition. Where there are fewer entries in a class than the number of premiums offered, the judge may, at their discretion, award prizes of such grade as the animals deserve.

57. UNETHICALLY FITTED LIVESTOCK. Judges shall not award a prize to an unworthy exhibit. It is the intention of the Management that no premium or distinction of any kind shall be given any animal that is not deserving. Unethically fitted animals will be barred from exhibition. Humane treatment of animals must be exercised at all times by all exhibitors and their employees. Animals that have been given any form of intoxicating beverage, tranquilizer or other drug affecting mood or attitude prior to judging will be disqualified. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the appearance or conformation of an animal for exhibition is prohibited and will be cause for disqualification. This includes but is not limited to stomach pumping, airing injections, bruising and balancing the udder by any means other than leaving naturally produced milk in any of the quarters. The use of graphite, powders, dyes, hemp, false tailheads, glued on hair, or hair-like substances, or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally is prohibited. Exceptions to this will be granted for practices which are accepted by the breed association sanctioning an event. Judges are also requested to report to the Management any animals upon which a surgical operation has been performed to improve their "show" appearance. If after examination by an official veterinarian, an animal is found to be in violation of any of the above: a) it will be barred from further exhibition; b) no awards will be made; c) stall and entry fees will not be refunded. The decision of the official veterinarian will be final. These rules will be strictly adhered to whether there is competition or not. (See Wholesome Meat Act, Page 30).

RULES REGARDING UNETHICAL FITTING WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

- **58. MEDICATION AND GROWTH STIMULANTS.** The use of medication or growth stimulants should be administered in accordance with the directions as printed on the product label in regard to dosage and withdrawal periods for milk producing and slaughter animals. A licensed veterinarian should be consulted before administering any medication or growth stimulant.
- **59. PROHIBITED FEED SUBSTANCES; MERCHANTABLE CONDITION.** No slaughter animal entry shall have been fed any substance in any manner not approved by the FDA and/or USDA for use on livestock for slaughter. Ruminant animals shall not have been fed any feed containing ruminant derived meat and bone meal or any other prohibited mammalian protein as defined by Food and Drug Administration Directive 21CFR589.2000. In addition, all slaughter animal entries shall be in merchantable condition. If this rule is violated, the animal will be disqualified, and exhibitor will forfeit all rights to sale proceeds, premiums and prizes.
- **60. ANIMALS DISQUALIFIED.** Should any animal awarded a prize be disqualified, the lower prize winning animals will remain as placed by the judge and will not be graduated up to higher positions.
- **61. RIBBON AWARDS.** The colors of ribbons designating awards are as follows: blue, first; red, second; white, third; pink, fourth; yellow, fifth; dark green, sixth; light green, seventh; tan, eighth; gray, ninth; from tenth place on, light blue.

SALES

62. SALE OF BREEDING ANIMALS. Breeding animal sales are under the management of the respective associations; however, animals entered in these sales, if eligible, must be entered in the breeding classes of that breed to be allowed to go through the sale.

FEED

Feed of all kinds will be available through the Stock Show Feed Department at reasonable prices. All feed and shavings must be paid for, in full, at time of purchase. Feed office will accept cash, checks and major credit cards for these purchases.

ALL EXHIBITORS MUST FURNISH THEIR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR TAX IDENTIFICATION NUMBER UPON REQUEST.

ENTRIES WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED UNLESS REQUIRED FEES ACCOMPANY ENTRY.

Credit cards are not accepted for any entry related fee.

UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE WHOLESOME MEAT ACT

The United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act applies to the market livestock which are exhibited and/or sold during the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show as follows:

- A. Animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drug or chemical residues.
- B. Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE POLICY

Samples of urine, blood and/or other body samples will be taken from the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Steers, Barrows, Wether Goats and Wether Lambs in the Junior Show and any other animals that may be randomly selected by the Show. All test samples will be delivered to the Texas Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory and/or another qualified laboratory chosen at the Show's discretion.

An animal will be disqualified and Exhibitor will forfeit all rights to sale proceeds, premiums and prizes if the animal tests positive (defined as any measurable quantity) for:

- 1. Any substance which is not approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and/or United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for use in slaughter animals and for use in the species and sex of the animal being exhibited;
- 2. Any substance which, regardless of approval by the FDA or USDA, has a required withdrawal period;
- 3. Any substance not administered in accordance with drug label directions; and/or
- 4. Any substance which has the potential to enhance an animal's performance including but not limited to steroids, diuretics, antiinflammatory, tranquilizers and pain killers.

It is the sole responsibility of the Exhibitor to insure that the animal is free of prohibited drugs and substances. Extent of knowledge on the part of the Exhibitor with regard to drugs or substances found in an animal is not relevant to any issue, and it shall not be a defense that a third party or unknown person introduced the prohibited substance into the animal. Exhibitor shall have sole responsibility for providing security for Exhibitor's animal(s) to prevent such occurrences.

WHOLESOME ASSURANCE STATEMENT

ATTENTION:

The use by non-veterinarians* of animal drugs or other substances in any manner other than in accord with the labeling approved by FDA is a violation of federal law.

*Note: Abuse of the extra-label privilege by veterinarians is unethical and is subject to serious consequences such as license revocation.

Any food animal must not exceed FDA/EPA/USDA-established tolerances for any foreign substance including drugs, pesticides, feed additives, or other chemicals.

Violative results of residue testing are subject to investigation by USDA and FDA for prosecution.

Any misrepresentation of a food animal that can potentially affect the acceptability of the carcass or milk will be considered fraud.

SPECIAL PRIZES FOR HERDSMEN

Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show -----\$3,465.00

Special prizes will be awarded to the herdsmen or 4-H or FFA group in charge of designated livestock exhibits. A committee appointed by the Management will make inspections during the Show to determine those who, in their judgment, make the best record for the period of the Show, taking into consideration the following points:

- 1. Orderliness and cleanliness of stalls and animals.
- 2. Promptness in having stalls or pens cleaned by 8 a.m. each day.
- 3. Systematic and neat arrangement of stall area and service alleys.
- 4. Adherence to tie out times.
- 5. Personal appearance of herdsmen and helpers.
- 6. Observance of all rules and regulations.
- 7. Cooperating with show officials in promoting the Livestock Show in general.
- 8. For awards, see heading of each department.

A \$50 grand prize will be awarded to the best herdsman in the cattle departments.

ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS 2025 SOUTHWESTERN EXPOSITION AND LIVESTOCK SHOW

The Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show is an intrastate (accepting entries of livestock and poultry only from within Texas) show for Junior Division livestock and all poultry entries and an interstate (accepting entries of livestock from within Texas and from other states) show for Open Division livestock and horse entries. Exhibitors with livestock originating outside the state of Texas are encouraged to contact their state Animal Health officials to confirm specific requirements (if any) their state may impose on animals returning from a Texas show.

THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF THE SOUTHWESTERN EXPOSITION AND LIVESTOCK SHOW ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS FOR ANIMALS ENTERING THE SHOW GROUNDS. IN SOME INSTANCES THESE REGULATIONS EXCEED CURRENT TEXAS ANIMAL HEALTH COMMISSION REGULATIONS THAT GOVERN MOVEMENT OF LIVESTOCK INTO SHOWS, FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS. THESE REGULATIONS ARE CURRENT AT THE TIME OF PUBLISHING THIS PREMIUM LIST. ANY NEW REGULATIONS WILL SUPERSEDE THIS SUMMARY IF THERE IS A DISPUTE BETWEEN THE TWO.

SALE CATTLE

Cattle that are consigned to sales, sold, leased, exchanged, gifted or otherwise under change of possession at the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show.

TEXAS ORIGIN

- A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.
- B. Must have approved identification for cattle; official breed registry tattoos or firebrands or USDA approved tags. Contact Texas Animal Health Commission for more information.
- C. Breeding bulls must be either eighteen (18) months of age or younger and certified as a virgin with registered papers or be tested negative for trichomoniasis within the past thirty (30) days.

OUT OF STATE ORIGIN

- A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within thirty (30) days of entry into Texas and/or Show Grounds.
- B. Must have approved identification for cattle; official breed registry tattoos or firebrands or USDA approved tags. Contact Texas Animal Health Commission for more information.
- C. Breeding bulls must be either less than twelve (12) months of age or be tested negative for trichomoniasis with an official **Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test** within the past sixty (60) days.

OPEN DIVISION BREEDING BEEF CATTLE

TEXAS ORIGIN

A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.

OUT OF STATE ORIGIN

- A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within thirty (30) days of entry into Texas and/or Show Grounds.
- B. Must have approved identification for cattle; official breed registry tattoos or firebrands or USDA approved tags. Contact Texas Animal Health Commission for more information.
- C. Breeding bulls more than twelve (12) months of age must be tested negative for trichomoniasis with an official Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test within thirty (30) days of entry into Texas and/or Show Grounds or have a Prior Entry Permit.

A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.

OPEN DIVISION DAIRY CATTLE

- B. Must have approved identification device for Texas dairy cattle; official breed registry tattoos or firebrands or USDA approved tags. Contact Texas Animal Health Commission for more information.
- C. Lactating dairy cattle must have a negative <u>Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test</u> result for Influenza A virus within the past seven (7) days.

OUT OF STATE ORIGIN

- A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within thirty (30) days of entry into Texas and/or Show Grounds.
- B. Must have approved identification device for Texas dairy cattle; official breed registry tattoos or firebrands or USDA approved tags. Contact Texas Animal Health Commission for more information.
- C. Negative tuberculosis (TB) test within the past sixty (60) days for all sexually intact cattle two (2) months of age of older.

- A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.
- B. All animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification. Scrapie Eradication Program Identification numbers must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

OUT OF STATE ORIGIN

- A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.
- B. All animals must have official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification. Scrapie Eradication Program Identification numbers must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
- C. Negative ELISA test for brucella ovis within the past thirty (30) days for all breeding rams which are six (6) months of age or older.

- 1. Each ram shall be individually identified with an individual ear tag or registration tattoo.
- 2. This identification, along with the brucella ovis test date and name of laboratory performing the test, shall be recorded on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Exemption:

1. Rams from a certified brucella ovis-free flock with the certified free number and anniversary test date listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

- B. Leptospirosis vaccination is required on breeding swine within thirty (30) days with Leptospirosis vaccine containing the following strains: Canicola, Grippotyphosan, Hardjo, Icterohaemorrhagiae, Pomona.
- C. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must contain the following statement from the issuing veterinarian, "To the best of my knowledge, swine represented on this certificate have not originated from a premises known to be affected by Novel Swine Enteric Coronavirus Disease(s) (SECD), and have not been exposed to SECD within the last thirty (30) days."

OUT OF STATE ORIGIN

- A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days is required for all swine listing identification with USDA approved tags (US emblem on tag) and including a statement that they have not been fed garbage.
- B. Negative brucellosis and psuedorabies test within past thirty (30) days unless originating from a current validated herd.
- C. Leptospirosis vaccination is required on breeding swine within thirty (30) days with Leptospirosis vaccine containing the following strains: Canicola, Grippotyphosan, Hardjo, Icterohaemorrhagiae, Pomona.
- D. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must contain the following statement from the issuing veterinarian, "To the best of my knowledge, swine represented on this certificate have not originated from a premises known to be affected by Novel Swine Enteric Coronavirus Disease(s) (SECD), and have not been exposed to SECD within the last thirty (30) days."

JUNIOR DIVISION MARKET SWINE (Barrows)

A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within the past thirty (30) days.

OUT OF STATE ORIGIN

A. Horses must meet the same requirements as Texas origin horses.

SALE HORSES (And Other Equine)

These regulations apply to all equine entering the Show Grounds for use of Sale.

TEXAS ORIGIN

- A. Original Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within thirty (30) days.
- B. Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test, also known as a "Coggins" Test, within the past six (6) months. Test date, accession number and name of laboratory must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Exemption:
 - 1. Equine may enter shows, fairs, exhibitions or assemblies without a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection when accompanied by a current Equine Passport or a Global Vet Link (GVL) Extended Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (EECVI) and a completed VS-Form 10-11 showing negative results to an official EIA test within the previous six (6) months.
- C. Vet statement for mares 24 months of age or older at the time of sale confirming pregnancy status and both (two) ovaries and for all stallions 13 months of age or older at the time of sale have two descended testicles.

OUT OF STATE ORIGIN

A. Horses must meet the same requirements as Texas origin horses.

SHEEP DOGS

A. All dogs entering the Show Grounds must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within thirty (30) days which states that the dog has been rabies vaccinated within one (1) year of the Stock Show competition dates.

POULTRY

TEXAS ORIGIN

- A. Negative pullorum-typhoid test within the past thirty (30) days for individual birds or be from a flock that meets either the Texas Pullorum-Typhoid Program or the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) and are accompanied by a VS Form 9-2 or NPIP Form 3B testing report.
- B. Poultry must originate from an area where reportable avian diseases are not known to have been active in the last thirty (30) days.
- C. If poultry are vaccinated, the vaccination must be with vaccines approved by USDA and TAHC. Contact TAHC for a list of approved vaccines. NOTE: No modified live virus chick embryo origin Laryngotracheitis (LT) vaccine and no modified live virus mycoplasma gallisepticum (MG) attenuated vaccine may be used on poultry entering the state.

- 1. The American Angus Association®, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri 64506-2912, will participate according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium amount is based on the previous year's number of head shown. The Association's contribution will be paid directly from the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show office to the exhibitors.
- 2. **REMINDER-Entry Verification.** Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 12 p.m. until 3 p.m., Thursday, January 30 and 8 a.m. until 11 a.m., Friday, January 31.
- 3. Premiums from the Association are paid by registration number. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on Championship or any group classes.
- 4. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association® available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association® pedigree look up. Any animal upon check-in which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo, freeze-branded or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the Show.
- 5. Any female shown with a calf at side, the calf must be her most recent natural calf and be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check in. Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications are not eligible to show in the Cow/Calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Cow/Calf pairs do not show for Grand Champion Female and are ineligible to compete in the Get-of-Sire, Junior Get-of-Sire and Breeder's Six-Head classes.
- 6. Only one (1) person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
- 7. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches. Coloring agents are not allowed.
- 8. Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association® are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association.
- 9. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
- 10. Any classes listed which exceed more than 15 head should be broken into smaller classes by dividing the classes as evenly as possible without splitting animals with the same birthdate. If there are more than 30 head in a division, the division should be split into Division 1, Division 2, etc.

- 3. An individual who has an entry in a Beefmaster Promotion Group (BPG) approved show must be a member of the BPG and must be at least 6 years of age as of the day of the show. All cattle must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United (BBU). For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in a BPG approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases BPG and their respective officials, sponsors, agents, officers, directors, employees and representatives, from any and all claims, liabilities, suits and judgments, arising from or connected with the administration or use of any animal test, rule enforcement and the resulting decision or action based thereon.
- 4. All animal tattoos will be checked for legibility and must match the registration papers for that animal. Animals with illegible tattoos or incorrect papers will not be allowed to show.
- 5. Animals entered in group classes, must have been shown in an individual class.
- 6. Heifers exhibited at twenty-four (24) months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy or be nursing their natural calf-at-side. If calf is over 6 months old, cow must be palpated safe in calf and so stated on health paper.
- 7. All bulls twenty (20) months of age or older that are exhibited must have passed a fertility examination given by a licensed veterinarian to be eligible to show and the results must be presented at check in. Once a bull has a positive exam, retesting is not required. All bulls 12 months and older must be led with a nose lead at all times.
- 8. All animals must be shown with their hair coats lying downward and flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible and must be done in those few areas such as the neck and portions of the topline of the animal which may not naturally lay flat against the body. Hair may not be trained upwards or forwards and/or pulled upwards or forwards on any part of the animal's body. No animals may have any foreign object(s) attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. An exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points from the show.

All animals exhibited must be registered with the American Brahman Breeders Association ("ABBA") and be appropriately fire branded as provided by ABBA requirements for registration in the ABBA Official Brahman Herdbook. All animals exhibited are subject to the ABBA DNA Verification Rules as established from time to time. A copy of the most current ABBA DNA Verification Rules may be obtained from the ABBA. In cases where families, companies, corporations, etc., are operated as a unit under the same management, but have cattle also registered in the names of individual partners, said cattle, even though bearing a different ownership brand, are eligible to be shown in competition under firm name provided they have not been and will not be shown in the name of the individuals.
- 2. **REMINDER-Entry Verification.** Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Corral Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m., Friday, January 17 and 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., Saturday, January 18.
- 3. All animals exhibited are subject to the ABBA Color Classification Rules as established from time to time. A copy of the most current ABBA Color Classification Rules may be obtained from the ABBA.
- 4. All females exhibited in the Senior Division must either [1] be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian (within 90 days prior to the date of the Show) certifying the Animal is pregnant and such certificate shall be made available for inspection and verification upon request, [2] be in a lactating stage and have her natural, nursing calf at side, which calf has not exceeded 240 days old as of the date of the Show, or [3] have weaned her natural calf which calf is registered in the ABBA Official Brahman Herdbook and the calf's registration certificate is available for inspection and verification upon request.
- 5. All females exhibited in the Aged Senior Division must either [1] be in a lactating stage and have her natural, nursing calf at side which calf has not exceeded 240 days old as of the date of the Show, or [2] have weaned her natural calf which calf is registered in the ABBA Official Brahman Herdbook and the calf's registration certificate is available for inspection and verification upon request.
- 6. All bulls must be exhibited with a permanent or temporary nose ring with an appropriate lead attached. Senior and Aged Senior Divisions must be accompanied by a valid, satisfactory Breeding Soundness Exam (BSE) certification issued by a licensed veterinarian (within one year prior to the date of the Show) and such certification shall be made available for inspection and verification upon request.
- 7. All animals in the **Calf and Junior Yearling Divisions** which have been previously disqualified from being exhibited at an ABBA Approved Show based on not meeting Weights and Measures Parameters may not be exhibited at another ABBA Approved Show until such time as [1] the animal re-qualifies by meeting Weights and Measures Parameters at a subsequent ABBA Approved Show where weights and measures are taken, or [2] the animal is no longer being exhibited in the Calf or Junior Yearling Divisions at ABBA Approved Shows.
- 8. **All Group Classes** will be exhibited at the beginning of the ABBA Approved Show prior to any individual classes being exhibited in such Show. All individual animals exhibited in group classes must be presented by an individual showman for each participating animal for the group to be placed by the judge(s). Each animal in the group must also be exhibited in their appropriate individual class. All entries will be placed by judges.
- 9. 1. Show Fees:

Youth Division Show: \$40 per head Open Division Show: \$40 per head

- 2. **Reminder-Entry Verification.** Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to the Superintendents at the Corral Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m., Friday, January 17 and 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., Saturday, January 18.
- 3. All Braunvieh entries must be duly registered in the Braunvieh Association of America (BAA) Herd Book and have a DNA sample on file with the BAA. A hair, tissue or blood sample on the subject animal must be received by the BAA or BAA representative prior to show. Nursing calves showing only at side of their dam are exempt from the DNA requirement. If nursing calves show in individual classes, they must then have a DNA sample on file. All animals exhibited must have a known Braunvieh dam or sire and are subject to DNA verification. Animals must be fullblood or purebred to qualify for the FB/PB Braunvieh Show. Braunvieh Beefbuilders will be shown in a seperate Beefbuilder show. Cattle recorded as "Braunvieh Influence" with a "BI" prefix are not eligible. A copy of the registration may be used for Braunvieh check-in. Each animal must bear a legible tattoo matching its registration papers.
- 4. The BAA reserves the right to provide the judge and audience with Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) values, ultrasound data (collected by a certified technician), scrotal circumference for bulls, weights and ratios for performance and weights with weight-per-day of age. Performance figures (including weights, hip heights and frame scores) can be presented in their entirety or any combination deemed necessary by BAA.
- 5. Females born on or prior to August 31, 2022 must show in the cow/calf class with a natural born calf at side. The registration status of the cow (FB/PB or Beefbuilder) will determine the division the pairs show in. Calves from the cow/calf class can be no more than 230 days of age on date of show. Calves from the cow/calf class can be entered and shown as individuals in the show. The pair will not be eligible for champion female/heifer.
- 6. Heifers born September 1, 2022 and after will show in the heifer show but can show with natural calves at side and still be eligible to show for champion female/heifer. Heifers exhibited at twenty (20) months of age or older (not females in the cow/calf class) must be pregnant and accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or show with a natural calf at side. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection. Any protest on pregnancy will be handled with a blood test to prove the pregnancy status.
- 7. Bulls exhibited at fourteen (14) months of age or older must have a positive semen test and a certificate to that effect. The certificate must be available for inspection. Bulls 12 months and older will have a nose ring or nose lead to be shown.
- 8. Altering animal's natural color will not be allowed. No cosmetic surgeries other than surgical dehorning will be allowed. Only generally accepted fitting practices will be allowed. Violation will be cause for disqualification. Show committee will make ruling on case by case basis. Animals disqualified will forfeit entry fees, awards and show points.
- 9. Protests can be made to the show committee with a \$150.00 protest fee within 24 hours of the show or prior to release, whichever is first, in writing to BAA staff or show committee members. Show committee will make rulings on a case by case basis. Animals disqualified will forfeit entry fees, awards and show points. If ruling in favor of protest, fee will be refunded. If ruling against, the fee will be forfeited.
- 10. Appeals can be made to the show committee with a \$150.00 appeal fee. Appeals will be forwarded with all information to the ethics committee and Executive Vice President. If appeal is granted, fee will be returned with reinstatement of show points and any other forfeited entry fees and awards. If appeal is denied, fee will be forfeited. Decision of the ethics committee and Executive Vice President will be final.



- 1. All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Class must be purebred and registered with American-International Charolais Association. Only bona fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership. NO PHOTOCOPIES.
- 2. **REMINDER-Entry Verification.** Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to the Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m., Thursday, January 30.
- 3. An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herdbook.
- 4. Animals registered in the AICA Color Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the qualifications of the AICA Rules and Regulations.
- 5. All animals, to be eligible, may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.
- 6. All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted. Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing. AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggests that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.
- 7. Bulls from Classes 48, 49, 52, 53 and 54 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.
- 8. All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow/Calf class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2022. Calves must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2022, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.
- 9. All females twenty (20) months and older exhibited at AICA sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.
- 10. All exhibits of Charolais breeding cattle shall be governed by the AICA rules and regulations, Article XV, titled "Exhibition of Animals." The inspection of exhibit cattle is specified in Article XV, Paragraph C, of the Association rules and regulations and non-compliance of exhibit inspection is specified in Paragraph D of the same Article XV.

- 2. **REMINDER-Entry Verification.** Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 9 a.m. until 1 p.m., Thursday, January 30.
- 3. Chianina entered must be registered with the American Chianina Association (ACA) by entry closing date and must be owned and registered in the name of a member of the ACA or Junior ACA. Both Fullblood and Percentage Chianina will be eligible to show. All entries must have a minimum of 6.25% Chianina blood in order to participate in ACA nationally sponsored shows.
- 4. The original ACA registration certificate (or photocopy) for each entry must be available for presentation to the Superintendent or Livestock Show Director at the time entries are verified prior to judging. All tattoos will be checked and must correspond with the registration papers. Any animal not having a legible tattoo, or a tattoo not corresponding with its ACA papers, will be ineligible to compete and will be barred from showing.
- 5. Exhibitor agrees to abide by all show rules of the American Chianina Association and the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show.
- 6. All bulls shown in individual classes must have a permanent nose ring and an attached lead.
- 7. All females eighteen (18) months of age and older must have a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.
- 8. There will be a cow/calf class in each division, and a Grand Champion Pair will be selected. The pair will not show against the heifer for Grand Champion Heifer. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf division are not allowed to show in individual classes. All cows and calves must be registered with the ACA. The maximum age for calves is 260 days. No maximum age limit on the cows. The registration catagory of the cow determines the division in which the pair shows. Calves shown at the cow's side must be the cow's natural calf. The exhibitor may be asked to allow the calf to nurse the cow. Cow/Calf entries must submit two (2) \$40 cattle show fees.



- 1. All cattle including calves on the side of cow-calf pairs and senior yearlings entered must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Hereford Association (AHA). Entries with registrations "pending" or illegible tattoos or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors are subject to the Association's special rule on class qualification. Entries in these classes are accepted with the understanding that the exhibitor agrees to abide by the rule in all respects.
- 2. Reminder-Entry Verification. Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 9 a.m. until Noon, on Friday, January 31.
- 3. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed.
- 4. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of graphite, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids or growth stimulants internally.
- 5. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method by mouth or esophagus, is prohibited.
- 6. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in their respective single-age class. No transfer from one (1) breed to another, after entry, will be permitted.
- 7. Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) values will be provided to the judge and audience for all animals shown. Animals without EPD data are eligible to show but will have N/A (not available) in place of missing data.
- 8. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
- 9. All Hereford animals must be officially recorded (registered) prior to show date to be eligible to show at a National Hereford Show.
- 10. An animal that is scurred (scurs are small, rudimentary horns that are loosely attached to the head, which are considered to be expressed only in animals that are genetically heterozygous for the polled gene) will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed to be scurred by an AHA field representative, then this designation will be placed on the animal's registration papers. Once this determination has been made and reported to the AHA office, then the owner may remove the scurs. Animals with scurs removed will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed polled or scurred, it will retain this designation forever.
- 11. The individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in at the show. They will be judged from the youngest to the oldest animal within each class.
- 12. It is recommended by the AHA Show Committee that classes with 10 or more head be considered to be split, depending on animals' birthdates in each particular class.
- 13. If the number of classes in a division warrant, a division will be split into multiple divisions.
- 14. Calves on the side of cow-calf pairs and senior yearlings MUST BE the cow's natural calf and fully registered with the AHA.





- 1. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the American Maine-Anjou Association (AMAA). When an entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide with the rules and regulations established by the AMAA as well as the rules of the Show Management. Entries found to be misrepresented, or persons not abiding by the Show rules, may be disqualified from showing.
- 2. **REMINDER-Entry Verification**. Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m., Friday, January 31.
- 3. All animals must be registered in the AMAA or Canadian Associations. The original certificate is required for presentation before the Show. Digital registration papers will be allowed if issued from AMAA staff. The PDF documents will have to be shown to AMAA staff member/show official, and the animal must have their tattoo checked at check-in.
- 4. Animals in MaineTainer Division classes must be 1/4 to 5/8 Maine-Anjou. Animals in Purebred Division classes must be 75% Maine-Anjou or greater. Animals in Fullblood Division classes must be 100% Maine-Anjou. All horned animals over seven (7) months of age must be dehorned.
- 5. Any and all cattle shall be made available to have blood drawn for parentage verification, detection of foreign substances, or the presence of altering. If recorded parent is excluded as a result of blood typing the owner may, at his expense, request the AMAA to determine actual parent. Failure to determine parentage will result in disqualification of that animal from the AMAA herd book.
- 6. Bulls ten (10) months of age and older shall be shown with a bull lead in place.
- 7. Heifers exhibited at twenty (20) months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
- 8. Bulls exhibited at fourteen (14) months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
- 9. Exhibitors shall wear a show harness to exhibit entry numbers and performance data cards for all AMAA sponsored shows.
- 10. Classes of twelve (12) or more animals shall be split as near to equal numbers as possible by the Show Superintendent.
- 11. Protests must be submitted in writing at least 24 hours prior to the beginning of judging or at the conclusion of judging. Written protests are accompanied by \$150 non-refundable fee and three (3) signatures of current AMAA members. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation and, depending on the basis of protest, a decision may be withheld until a complete investigation is made.
- 12. **Show Format** Maine-Anjou Show will begin with the Fullblood classes (females followed by bulls), followed by Group Classes, followed by the Purebred classes (females followed by bulls), followed by the MaineTainer Bull Show and followed by the MaineTainer Female Show.

- 1. All cattle including calves on the side of cow-calf pairs and senior yearlings entered must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Hereford Association (AHA). Entries with registrations "pending" or illegible tattoos or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors are subject to the Association's special rule on class qualification. Entries in these classes are accepted with the understanding that the exhibitor agrees to abide by the rule in all respects.
- 2. **REMINDER-Entry Verification.** Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 9 a.m. until Noon, on Friday, January 31.
- 3. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed.
- 4. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of graphite, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids or growth stimulants internally.
- 5. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method by mouth or esophagus, is prohibited.
- 6. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in their respective single-age class. No transfer from one (1) breed to another, after entry, will be permitted.
- 7. Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) values will be provided to the judge and audience for all animals shown. Animals without EPD data are eligible to show but will have N/A (not available) in place of missing data.
- 8. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
- 9. All Hereford animals must be officially recorded (registered) prior to show date to be eligible to show at a National Hereford Show.
- 10. An animal that is scurred (scurs are small, rudimentary horns that are loosely attached to the head, which are considered to be expressed only in animals that are genetically heterozygous for the polled gene) will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed to be scurred by an AHA field representative, then this designation will be placed on the animal's registration papers. Once this determination has been made and reported to the AHA office, then the owner may remove the scurs. Animals with scurs removed will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed polled or scurred, it will retain this designation forever.
- 11. The individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in at the show. They will be judged from the youngest to the oldest animal within each class.
- 12. It is recommended by the AHA Show Committee that classes with 10 or more head be considered to be split, depending on animals' birthdates in each particular class.
- 13. If the number of classes in a division warrant, a division will be split into multiple divisions.
- 14. Calves on the side of cow-calf pairs and senior yearlings MUST BE the cow's natural calf and fully registered with the AHA.



- 2. All animals entered must conform to all Show and Association eligibility requirements. <u>Substitutions will be permitted</u> for animals within heifer and/or bull divisions of the Red Angus breed.
- 3. **REMINDER-Entry Verification**. Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 12 p.m. until 3 p.m., Thursday, January 30 and 8 a.m. until 11 a.m., Friday, January 31.
- 4. Ownership Requirements. All animals entered in a Red Angus Association of America sponsored show will:
 - Have at least one (1) owner on record as a Regular or Junior Member of RAAA by check-in.
 - Be registered with RAAA and meet requirements for Category 1A by entry deadline.
 - Have Official Registered Status by check-in (On an R status instead of a Z, U or B.).
- 5. Exhibitors must have Official Registration Certificates, an electronic copy or another proof of ownership issued by the RAAA pedigree look-up. This may include officially produced copies of Original Registration Certificates obtainable from the Red Angus Association National Office.
- 6. All females twenty (20) months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side, which need not be registered, but must be eligible for category 1A registration in the RAAA. Failure to show documentation will result in the animal being ineligible to show.
- 7. All bulls nine (9) months of age or older must be shown with a nose lead.
- 8. Any exhibitor who loses control of his/her animal twice in the show ring will be required to remove the animal from the ring.

All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered or recorded (50% 75% with one parent a registered Santa Gertrudis), meeting the requirements for registration or recordation as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis Rules and Regulations for Registration, and shall be governed by the last revised version of the Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open and Junior Shows as approved by the Board of Santa Gertrudis Breeders International, PO Box 1257, Kingsville, TX 78364. A copy may be obtained by contacting the association or viewed at www.santagertrudis.com. Each owner must be a member in good standing with SGBI. All animals must be registered or recorded and PERMANENTLY identified before the show with a brand ID or an ear tattoo.
- 2. **REMINDER-Entry Verification**. Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to the Superintendents in the Corral Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m., Friday, January 17 and 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., Saturday, January 18.
- 3. All bulls eleven (11) months of age and older must be exhibited with a permanent nose ring.
- 4. Heifers twenty-four (24) months of age or older must be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian or have produced a live, Santa Gertrudis sired calf with that calf at side meeting the Standard of Excellence and the calf must be registered by thirty (30) days of age. All bulls twenty-four (24) months of age or older must provide a passing BSE test per show season.
- 5. All Purebred animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs and tail, and with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. Star Five animals are not subject to purebred clipping rules; Star Five animals are to be blow and go, hair may be brushed according to preference with no paint or adhesives on any part of the body. Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show.
- 6. Classes with over thirty (30) entries will be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.

- 2. Reminder-Entry Verification. Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to the Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 11 a.m. until 3 p.m., Thursday, January 30.
- 3. All Shorthorn and ShorthornPlus are subject to a tattoo inspection, parentage DNA testing, an age inspection and/or females 20 months of age on day of show are subject to a blood test to prove pregnancy if deemed necessary by the ASA. The decision of the examining veterinarian is final.
- 4. The original registration certificate for each entry must be available for presentation to the Superintendent or Manager of the Show at the time entries are verified prior to judging. American Shorthorn Association staff will accept electronic registration papers at ASA sanctioned shows for check-in.



PROGRESS THROUGH PERFORMANCE EVENT SPECIAL RULES

- 1. All entries must be either Purebred Simmental, Percentage Simmental (50% up to, but not including Purebred), Purebred Simbrah (5/8 SM 3/8 BR) or Percentage Simbrah (American Simbrah Registry on the official registration and capable of producing a Purebred Simbrah calf). All entries will be subject to Progress Through Performance guidelines and Texas Simmental/Simbrah Association guidelines.
- 2. **REMINDER-Entry Verification**. Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to the Superintendents at the Cactus Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m., Thursday, January 30.
- 3. Proof of registration for each entry must be available to the Superintendent or Livestock Show Director at the time entries are verified. Proof of registration may be an official registration certificate, a printed copy of the digital certificate or a printout from ASA's Herdbook.
- 4. In cases where families, companies and/or corporations, etc. are operated as a unit under the same management, but also have cattle registered in the names of individual partners, said cattle (even though bearing a different ownership) are eligible to be shown in competition under firm name provided that they have not been and will not be, shown in the name of the individuals.
- 5. Two-year-old heifers must have produced a calf or be safe in calf as verified by a licensed veterinarian or have been used as a donor female and have produced viable, fertilized embryos as verified by the owner.
- 6. No calf, either heifer or bull, can be shown at side of dam, if older than 205 days on day of show.
- 7. Tattoos may be checked at ASA or TSSA discretion for show eligibility.
- 8. Grand and Reserve Grand Champions will have DNA samples pulled for and tested for parentage and genomics, unless previously tested. ASA has the option to pull additional random DNA samples. DNA collection will occur at the exhibition site and will be supervised and/or conducted by ASA staff. Failure to submit to DNA testing will result in automatic disqualification.
- 9. This is a PTP Ring of Champions event. All exhibitors and entries are required to conform with PTP rules and regulations, found online at simmental.org>ASA Programs>Progress Through Performance.



- 1. Entry in this division is open to individuals, firms or partnerships. Heifer entries may be registered fullbloods or crossbreds, so long as they are in keeping with quality standards of the Sale Committee. Preference will be given to heifers bred, raised and consigned by one (1) entity.
- 2. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show as published in this Premium List.
- 3. Eligibility. All entries must be at least eighteen (18) months old and not more than three (3) years old as of January 1, 2025. Bred heifers and heifers with calves at side will be shown and sold in pens with a minimum of ten (10) and a maximum of twelve (12) head. They shall be uniform as to kind, age, size, pregnancy status, etc.
- 4. A nomination fee of \$18 per head must accompany the nomination form. Deadline for nomination shall be December 1, 2024. A selling fee (commission) of 8.5% of the gross sale will be charged. All entries in this department are to be sent to Schacher Auction Services.



- 1. Read General Rules. All entries and awards in this department will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations published in this *Premium List*, insofar as they pertain to dairy cattle.
- 2. Reminder-Entry Verification. Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Corral Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m., Friday, January 17 and 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., Saturday, January 18.
- 3. Certificates of Registry. Registration certificates on each animal entered in the Dairy Cattle Show must be presented to the Superintendent of the Dairy Cattle Department for checking not later than 5 p.m., Saturday, January 18. Application for transfer will not be accepted. NO FAXES ACCEPTED.
- 4. **Ownership.** Ownership will be defined by the Certificate of Registration. Animals owned in partnership may be entered in one (1) owner's name but must appear under this ownership in all classes. Application for transfer will not be accepted.
- 5. Milk Produced in the Milking Parlor. All milk produced in the milking parlor will be bought by Dairy Farmers of America which will make payment for the product to the Texas Purebred Dairy Cattle Association. The secretary of the Texas Purebred Dairy Cattle Association will make payment to the individual exhibitor. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to properly identify their cows as they are milked.
- 6. Junior Exhibitors, Junior exhibitors may enter the same animal in the Open and Junior Shows. However, the Junior entry and the Open entry must be submitted on separate entry applications. Only one (1) Agent Summary Sheet is needed for both entries. An additional cattle show fee of \$40 must be paid with the Junior entry. ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED BY THE ENTRY CLOSING DEADLINE.
- 7. **Heifers in Milk.** All heifers shown in milk must be shown in classes for females calved after September 1, 2022.
- 8. Dairy Cattle Sifting Committee. A dairy cattle sifting committee, of which the Dairy Cattle Department Superintendent will be a member, will be appointed by the Show Management to inspect and sift the cattle in this department.
- 9. Number of Entries. No exhibitor will be allowed to exhibit more than four (4) entries in any class of the Dairy Cattle Department.
- 10. Judging Format. Ayrshire and Milking Shorthorn cattle will be judged at 3 p.m., Sunday, January 19. The youngest class of Ayrshire females will be judged first, followed by the youngest class of Milking Shorthorn females. The remainder of the classes will be judged youngest to oldest, alternating between the two breeds. Brown Swiss and Guernsey cattle will be judged at 8 a.m., Monday, January 20. The youngest class of Brown Swiss females will be judged first, followed by the youngest class of Guernsey females. The remainder of the classes will be judged youngest to oldest, alternating between the two breeds. Jersey cattle will be judged at Noon, and Holstein cattle will be judged at 3 p.m., Monday, January 20.
- 11. Group Class Description for All Breeds:
 - Produce of Dam-To consist of two (2) females, any age, the produce of one (1) cow. Each exhibitor is limited to one (1) entry.
 - Best Three Females-Three (3) females, any age, all bred and at least one (1) owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one (1) entry.
 - Breeders Herd of Five Females—Group to consist of two (2) animals shown in classes eligible for Junior Champion Female, two (2) animals shown in classes eligible for Senior Champion Female, and one (1) female any age; all owned and at least three (3) bred by exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one (1) entry.
 - Premier Exhibitor-The Exhibitor accumulating the most points on animals, not to exceed six (6), owned and exhibited by himself in the Open Show single classes.
 - Premier Breeder-The Breeder accumulating the most points on animals, not to exceed six (6), bred by him and exhibited by him and/or others in the Open Show single classes.
- 12. Group Class Entries. All entries in group classes must be made on a separate entry application and be submitted prior to entry closing deadline.

NOTICE: Rules regarding Unethical Fitting will be strictly enforced. See Page 29, General Rules 57.

13. **Exhibitor and Breeder Definition.** Exhibitor and Breeder is defined as follows: Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one (1) farm and where the herd is one (1) unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Premier Exhibitor, Premier Breeder, Dairy Herd, Produce of Dam and Best Three Females Classes. 

- 3. This department will consist of two (2) separate shows, the All American Dairy Goat Show and the Southwestern Classic Dairy Goat Show. Exhibitors may enter animals in one (1) or both Shows. An entry application for each entry in each Show will need to be filled out by the exhibitor. SHOW FEE \$40 Per Animal Per Class Per Show. ENTRIES IN BOTH DAIRY GOAT SHOWS MUST BE MADE BY ENTRY CLOSING DEADLINE.
- 4. Entries. Each exhibitor may enter a maximum of four (4) entries in each class. Only Dairy Goats officially entered in the Show will be allowed on the Grounds. - 11. IT IS REQUIRED THAT ALL EXHIBITORS WEAR ALL WHITE OR DARK PANTS AND WHITE SHIRT.
- 12. It is a requirement that ALL Does in Best Doe in Show and Best Udder be milked out prior to entering ring.





SPECIAL RULES

- 1. **Read General Rules.** All entries and awards in this department will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations published in this *Premium List* and the following Special Rules.
- 2. **Eligibility of Animals.** All breeding sheep must be registered in the recognized Flock Books of their respective breeds and must bear such identification as that breed association requires before entering the ring. Registry certificate of ownership must be produced at the request of the Superintendent.
- 3. **Disqualifications.** Any sheep showing any pronounced defect or abnormality, such as weak constitution, unthrifty condition, overshot jaw or undershot jaw, will be barred from showing in any of the breeding classes.
- 4. **Record of Numbers.** The records of awards must have the correct ear tag and entry numbers of all animals awarded prizes. All entries must bear an association ear identification number in order to receive premiums. It is not necessary to show ear identification numbers on entry application.
- 5. **Entries.** Each exhibitor may show two (2) animals in each of the single classes, but will be restricted to only one (1) entry in each group class. **ENTRIES IN GROUP CLASSES MUST BE MADE ON A SEPARATE ENTRY APPLICATION BY ENTRY CLOSING DEADLINE.** To be eligible for a group class, the animals must be shown in a single class.
- 6. **REMINDER-Registration Verification.** Exhibitors will present registration papers for each animal entered to the Superintendents from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., Wednesday, January 22 and 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., Thursday, January 23. Animal information must be provided at time of entry. Substitution rule will apply to this Department. (see Rule 11, <u>Page 19</u>)
- 7. **Computing Ages.** While it is recognized that there is some variability in the age at which the different pairs of permanent incisor teeth first show, for the purpose of this Show (except in the case of breed association specials, when their rules will govern), the following rules will prevail:
 - (a) All lambs, in order to be eligible to compete in their respective classes, must be carrying all milk teeth at the time of entering the show ring. Lambs showing either or both of their first pair of permanent incisors will not be eligible to show in any of the lamb classes. Lambs under six (6) months of age will not be eligible.
 - (b) Sheep eligible to compete in the two-tooth breeding classes must show only the first pair of permanent incisors. Sheep which have dropped their central pair of milk teeth and show one (1) or both teeth of the first permanent pair are eligible to show as singles only in the two-tooth classes of their respective breeds.
 - (c) Sheep showing the second pair of three (3) pair of permanent incisors will be eligible to show as singles in the four- to six-tooth class only.
- 8. **Heelers.** Heelers are allowed in all classes.
- 9. Shown in Fleece:
 - **Delaine-Merino** four- to six-tooth must be shorn to the skin with mechanical shears on or after March 15 of the calender year preceding the Show leaving a uniform length of wool over the entire body.
 - Rambouillet must be shorn to the skin with mechanical shears on or after October 20 of the calender year preceding the Show leaving a uniform length of wool over the entire body. Wool on Rambouillet may not exceed two (2) inches in length. Boots may be left on Rambouillet.
 - Medium Wool and Hair Sheep must be shorn to the skin with mechanical shears one (1) week or less prior to showing leaving a uniform length over the entire body. Foretops and boots may be left on Medium Wool. Boots may be left on Hair Sheep.
- 10. **Points Considered.** The Rambouillet and Delaine-Merino breeding classes will be judged from a dual-purpose standpoint: body conformation and breed characteristics to count 50 percent, and wool production to count 50 percent, due consideration being given to the content of quality of the fleece.
- 11. **Exhibitor's Flock.** An exhibitor's flock in all breeds shall consist of one (1) ram, any of the eligible ages, two (2) two-to six-tooth ewes, and two (2) ewe lambs.



- 2. Commercial Crossbred Females. Upon arrival, exhibitors must obtain weight cards from Superintendent's Office for entries in these classes. Exhibitors are responsible for weighing their own gilts and must return weight cards to Superintendents prior to Noon, Saturday, January 25 with the declared weight. Any entry whose weight card is not received by this deadline will be disqualified. Placing gilts will be weighed back. Any gilt that weighs more than 10 lbs, above or below the weight turned in on the weight card will be disqualified. Classes will be determined after weight cards are turned in.
- 3. Registration Verification. Upon arrival, exhibitors must obtain animal information cards from Superintendent's Office. Exhibitors are responsible for filling out cards and presenting them to Superintendent with the Registration Paper for each registered entry from 1 p.m. until 5 p.m. on Friday, January 24 and 9 a.m. until Noon on Saturday, January 25.
- 4. Number of Entries. An exhibitor may enter and drive into the ring for exhibition and judging two (2) entries in any single class.



- 3. This department will consist of two (2) separate shows, the American Premier Boer Goat Show and the Yellow Rose Classic Boer Goat Show. Exhibitors may enter animals in one (1) or both Shows. An entry application for each Show will need to be filled out by the exhibitor. SHOW FEE \$40 Per Animal Per Show. 

SPECIAL RULES

Read General Rules and Regulations. All entries in this department will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations published in this *Premium List* and, in addition, the following Special Rules of this department:

1. Statement of Eligibility. The Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show makes available to County Extension Agents and Agricultural Science Teachers in charge of 4-H Clubs or FFA livestock programs the opportunity to enter members in their programs in the Junior Division of the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show, subject to the following Special Rules. These Special Rules are only minimum requirements for participation in the Show and are not intended to limit the right of any CEA or AST, or the Texas AgriLife Extension Service or the Texas Education Agency, to impose additional requirements as they deem necessary. The opportunity to enter 4-H Club and FFA member projects in the Junior Livestock Show is made available only to a CEA and AST supervising these livestock projects. In no event are these rules to be construed as making any offer or opportunity available to any 4-H Club or FFA member. In no event shall any CEA or AST be considered to be an agent of Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show for any purpose. Exhibitors must be bona fide members of a County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter. 4-H entrants must be actively enrolled in a 4-H program and be between the ages of nine (9) and eighteen (18) on August 31 of the coming show year or be eight (8) years old and in the 3rd grade. 4-H exhibitors must be enrolled in public or private elementary or secondary schools of Texas, FFA members must be actively enrolled in FFA and attending elementary or secondary schools in Texas, and be bona fide residents of Texas during the proper ownership periods and show dates. Exhibitors must have continuously, personally, fed and cared for their animals under the direct supervision of a CEA or AST for a period of time as stated under the ownership requirement in each department.

Country of Origin Labeling Requirements. All Junior market animals entered in the Barrow, Wether Goat, Wether Lamb and Steer Shows must be born and raised in the United States of America.

All Junior Livestock Exhibitors must be Quality Counts Verified, and Verification Number must be provided on all entry applications when entries are submitted. Entries will not be accepted without Quality Counts Verification Number.

CEA's or AST's will affirm such animals are in compliance when signing entry applications.

If an exhibitor has shown an animal which was placed as a Grand Champion Barrow, Wether Goat, Wether Lamb or Steer at this Show, the exhibitor cannot enter another animal of the same species in the Junior Division.

2. Submitting Entries. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE SIGNED AND SENT IN AT ONE (1) TIME BY THE COUNTY EXTENSION AGENT OR THE AGRICULTURAL SCIENCE TEACHER.

PAYMENT FOR ALL ENTRIES MUST BE INCLUDED IN ONE (1) CHECK. ENTRIES SENT IN BY INDIVIDUALS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AND WILL BE RETURNED.

JUNIOR EXHIBITORS ENTERING ANIMALS IN THE OPEN SHOW MUST SUBMIT THE ENTRIES BY THE NOVEMBER 15 ENTRY DEADLINE.

FOR THE 2025 JUNIOR BREEDING BEEF HEIFER SHOW:

A copy of the original registration certificate must be submitted with the entry application at the time of entry. Exhibitors are required to bring original registration paper to the show ring while exhibiting the heifer.

SPECIAL NOTE TO JUNIOR EXHIBITORS:

One (1) entry application will be needed for each single class you are entering, and one (1) entry application is needed for each group class you are entering.

One (1) Agent Summary Sheet is needed for the entire group of entries sent in by the County Extension Agent or the Agricultural Science Teacher.

ALL EXHIBITORS MUST FURNISH THEIR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR TAX IDENTIFICATION NUMBER UPON REQUEST.

- 3. **Passes.** See General Rules and Regulations, Rule 12 and Rule 13, Page 19.
- 4. **Refunds.** No refunds will be made after the entry closing date.

NO FANS IN THE JUNIOR SHOW

- 5. **Transfer of Entries.** No animal may be changed from one (1) class to another after entry closing date unless it is ineligible for the class in which it is entered.
- 6. **Stall and Pen Space.** Stalls or pens will not be reserved without the required fee. All animals entered in the Junior Livestock Show, in order to be eligible for competition, must be stalled or penned in the special divisions set aside for this purpose. Each exhibitor or caretaker must remain with their animals until definite stall or pen space has been assigned by the Department Superintendent.
- 7. **Tie Outs.** Tie Outs must be reserved and paid for at the time of entry. Tie Outs will be numbered and assigned (See note in General Rules and Regulations, Rule 4, <u>Page 18</u>).

TIE OUT TIME IS 7:30 P.M. - All cattle must be in their assigned stalls between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.

8. **Bedding.** All pens and stalls will be initially bedded with wood shavings upon arrival, with the exception of the Junior Barrow Show. Dairy Cattle will be bedded on straw. Additional wood shavings or straw will be available at the Feed Office. **NOTE:** No straw will be allowed in any of the barns except for Dairy Cattle.

NO LARGE ROUND OR SQUARE BALES OF STRAW OR HAY WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS.

- 9. **Cattle Grooming Chutes and Scales.** Each 4-H Club or FFA Chapter will be allowed to purchase grooming chute/scale permits by submitting a \$65 fee for each permit along with entries. Any apparatus used for a grooming chute and/or scale must be used in the stall and completely off concrete aisles. Grooming chute/scale stickers will be issued and must be placed on the upper, right hand corner at the back of the chute.
- 10. **Exhibitions.** All entries in the Junior Livestock Show must be exhibited by the owner/exhibitor, except when the exhibitor has more than one (1) entry in a class or cannot be present to show their own animal due to circumstances beyond their control. In these cases, a substitute showman may exhibit the animal provided that the substitute showman meets all Junior exhibitor criteria and is approved by the Superintendent of that department. A substitute showman **may not** exhibit animals for an owner/exhibitor participating in other events or activities (UIL competitions, school sports, etc.) or just being absent from the competition. If the exhibitor is scholastically ineligible to participate, as determined by the respective school district, the exhibitor and their entries are ineligible for competition.

Parents, Agricultural Science Teachers and County Extension Agents will not be allowed in the judging arena. An animal will be disqualified from the Show if it is being trimmed, fitted or dressed by anyone other than exhibitors, County Extension Agents or Agricultural Science Teachers from the State of Texas, or other feeders or leaders within the county or school district from which the animal is entered.

Exhibitors must remain in charge of their exhibits and care for them for the duration of the Show or have a competent caretaker, who will be on duty at all times, in charge of them.

NO PORTABLE COMMUNICATION DEVICES (I.E., CELL PHONES, RADIOS, TABLETS, SMART WATCHES, FITNESS TRACKING, ETC.) MAY BE USED BY EXHIBITORS DURING COMPETITION IN SHOW ARENAS. EXHIBITORS USING SUCH DEVICES WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY DISQUALIFIED.

11. **Artificial Coloring.** Any Junior animal entry which, when rubbed with a white cloth or glove shows residual evidence of artificial coloring, will be disqualified, with the exception of dressing on hoofs.

AS A SAFETY PRECAUTION FOR EXHIBITORS AND VISITORS, THE HEATING OF AEROSOL SPRAY CANS WILL BE STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

- 12. Partnerships. SHOWING ANIMALS UNDER A PARTNERSHIP WILL NOT BE PERMITTED, with the exception of Junior Breeding Sheep.
- 13. **Sifting Committee.** Sifting committees appointed by the Management will inspect all animals entered in the Junior Livestock Show. Sifted animals will be refused the privilege of competing for prizes and may be ordered from the Show Grounds, as it is intended that only animals which are creditable from standpoints of type, quality and finish shall be entered and shown.

All Junior Steer, Barrow and Wether Lamb Grand Champions, Reserve Grand Champions, Breed Champions and Reserve Breed Champions, as well as Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion and Division and Reserve Division Champion Wether Goats of the Show must be sold through the Junior Sale of Champions. Animals designated by the Management to be sold in the auction must remain under the exhibitor's care and expense until the animal is sold. The animals must be led into the sale ring by their owners or by another Junior exhibitor approved by the Show Management. All animals which go through the Sale will be sold to the highest bidder. Animals must be presented at the Sale in their natural state. Decoration of a sale animal is prohibited.
- 16. SCHEDULE AND PROCEDURES OF JUNIOR SHOW SALES. The show weight of all steers, barrows, wether lambs and wether goats will be the sale weight. No shrinkage will be taken. The sale of wether goats, wether lambs and steers other than the champions listed in Rule 15 are optional with the owners. The proceeds from the sale will be mailed to the exhibitor's County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher directly from the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show with the following commission charges deducted:
 - Steers -----\$34 per head
 - Barrows -----\$13 per head
 - Wether Goats-----\$12 per head
 - Wether Lambs -----\$12 per head

To receive payment, all exhibitors must deliver their animals to the sale personnel at the designated time and location and MUST turn in a delivery card for their animals. All exhibitors must furnish their social security number or tax identification number upon request.

PAYMENT WILL ONLY BE MADE TO THOSE EXHIBITORS WHO TURN IN A DELIVERY CARD.

Steers.

All prize winning steers will be eligible for the Junior Sale of Champions, PROVIDED DESIGNATION IS MADE AS ANIMAL LEAVES THE JUDGING RING. STEERS ENTERED FOR THE AUCTION SALE WILL BE IDENTIFIED BY A JAW BRAND (F) PLACED BY A SHOW OFFICIAL IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CLASS IS JUDGED AND BEFORE THE ANIMAL LEAVES THE JUDGING ARENA. All sifted and non-placing steers will be sold by sealed bid prior to Friday, February 7. To sell sifted and non-placing steers, the exhibitor must deliver the steer to the holding pen area on the east side of the Burnett Building at 4 p.m., Friday, February 7. All sifted and non-placing steers must be delivered by 5 p.m.

Barrows:

All barrows must go to slaughter. Barrows other than those listed in Rule 15, will be sold by sealed bid. Sifted barrows will be sold at a price discounted at 10¢ per pound. Bonus money will be paid to prize winning barrows based on a posted schedule. Barrows will be delivered to the sale personnel immediately following the judging of each class.

Wether Lambs: All wether lambs, other than those listed in Rule 15, will be sold by sealed bid. Bonus money will be paid to prize winning lambs based on a posted schedule. Exhibitors who wish to sell their wether lambs must deliver their animals to the designated area beginning at 4 p.m., Thursday, January 30. All lambs must be delivered within one hour from the conclusion of the Show.

Wether Goats:

All wether goats, other than those listed in Rule 15, will be sold by sealed bid. Bonus money will be paid to prize winning goats based on a posted schedule. Exhibitors who wish to sell their wether goats must deliver their animals to the designated area beginning at 2 p.m., Friday, January 31. All goats must be delivered within one hour from the conclusion of the Show.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. To be eligible, barrows must be validated with the Texas Swine Validation Program administered by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas Education Agency, division of Agricultural Science and Technology. The first and second place barrows in each class will be inspected to verify that the barrow's ear notches match those recorded at the time of validation. Breed Champions and Reserve Breed Champions, as well as any other barrows designated by the Show Management, will have samples collected for DNA analysis. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.
- 2. Each exhibitor is entitled to enter only one (1) barrow in the Junior Barrow Show and must have owned the barrow prior to December 1, 2024. The barrow must have been fed and cared for by the exhibitor from date of purchase.
- 3. **Upon Arrival.** A representative from each County 4-H Group or FFA Chapter must obtain, from the Superintendent's Office, a packet containing their group's ear tags and weight/breed cards for their entries in this division.
- 4. **Ear Tag Numbers.** All barrows must have ear tags that match barrow's entry number at the time they are presented in the show ring. Ear tags will be provided by Stock Show.
- 5. Weighing. Exhibitors will be responsible for weighing their own barrows and must return weight/breed cards to Superintendents by 10 a.m., Tuesday, February 4 with the declared weight and breed designation. Texas Swine Validation number must also be included on weight/breed cards. Any entry whose weight/breed card is not received by this deadline will be disqualified. To be eligible to show, all barrows must weigh not less than 250 lbs. or more than 290 lbs. Weight given on weight/breed card will be both the show weight and the sale weight. After weight/breed cards are turned in, entries will be divided into weight divisions as equal in number as possible. Placing barrows and any barrow designated by the Superintendents will be weighed back. Any barrow that weighs more than 10 lbs. above or below its show weight will be disqualified.
- 6. **Classifying.** Barrows will be classified at the time of judging by a three person committee. If the animal is classed out, it will be sifted. The decision of the committee will be final, and protests will not be considered by Management. See Classification Guidelines below.

All Junior Livestock Exhibitors must be Quality Counts Verified, and Verification Number must be provided on all entry applications when entries are submitted. Entries will not be accepted without Quality Counts Verification Number.

- 7. **Sale Animals.** All barrows must go to slaughter. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Barrows, as well as all Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion Barrows, will be sold in the Junior Sale of Champions Saturday, February 8 at 9 a.m. All other barrows will be sold by sealed bid, and bonus money will be paid to prize winning barrows. Sifted barrows will be sold at a price discounted at 10 cents per pound. **A delivery card must be turned in to the sale personnel on each barrow delivered.**
- 8. **Artificial Coloring.** Entries that are artificially colored with paint, paste, powder, oil or other dressing will be barred from showing. Only water will be allowed to be used.

CLASSIFICATION GUIDELINES

ALL BREEDS AND CROSSES:

All animals must be properly ear notched within seven (7) days of birth with a litter notch in the right ear and individual notch in the left ear to be eligible for the Texas 4-H and FFA Swine Validation Program and entry in the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show. Animals not properly notched in both ears will be disqualified.

BERKSHIRE-

- 1. Black and white with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire Breed character.
- 2. A Berkshire must have white on face and tail (unless tail is docked). Three (3) of the four (4) legs must be white.
- 3. A Berkshire must not have a solid white or a solid black face from the ears forward.
- 4. A Berkshire must not have a solid black nose (rim of nose).
- 5. White is allowed on the ears, but neither ear can be entirely white.
- 6. An occasional splash of white may appear on the body.

CLASSIFICATION GUIDELINES

CHESTER WHITE-

- 1. Must possess Chester White Breed character.
- 2. Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair, no more than five (5) pigmented areas.
- 3. Ears must be down and medium size.
- 4. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

DUROC-

- 1. Must be red in color and possess Duroc Breed character (ears must be down and medium size).
- 2. Must not have any white hair located on the animal.
- 3. Must not have any black hair.
- 4. Must not have more than three (3) black spots on the skin, and none of these spots can be larger than two (2) inches in diameter.
- 5. Must not have any shading or indication of a belt.

HAMPSHIRE-

- 1. Must be black in color with a white belt starting on a front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body.
- 2. Must possess Hampshire Breed character (ears must be erect and not rounded).
- 3. Must not have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
- 4. Must not have any red hair.

LANDRACE-

- 1. Must be white in color and possess Landrace Breed character (ears must be down).
- 2. Must not allow any color hair other than white.
- 3. Must not allow more than three (3) spots of skin pigmentation.
- 4. Must not allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one (1) U.S. minted quarter.

POLAND CHINA-

- 1. Must possess Poland China Breed character.
- 2. Must be black with a white face and switch (unless tail is docked). Three (3) of the four (4) legs must be white. May have an occasional splash of white on the body.
- 3. Must have ears down.
- 4. Must not have evidence of a belt formation.
- 5. Cannot have red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
- 6. Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering of ears with possible ear tags are ineligible.

SPOTTED-

- 1. Must be black and white.

YORKSHIRE-

- 1. Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire Breed character (ears must be erect).
- 2. Must not have any colored hair other than white.
- 3. Must not have colored skin pigmentation larger than one (1) U.S. minted silver dollar.
- 4. Must not have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. **Read General Rules.** All entries and awards in this department will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations published in this *Premium List* and to the following Special Rules.
- 2. **Eligibility of Animals.** All breeding sheep must be registered in the recognized Flock Books of their respective breed and must bear such identification as that breed association requires before entering the ring. Registry certificate of ownership must be produced at the request of the Superintendent.
- 3. **Disqualifications.** Any sheep showing a pronounced defect or abnormality, such as weak constitution, unthrifty condition, overshot jaw or undershot jaw, will be barred from showing in any of the breeding classes.
- 4. **Record of Numbers.** The records of awards must have the correct ear tag and entry numbers of all animals awarded prizes. All entries must bear an association ear identification number in order to receive premiums. It is not necessary to show ear identification numbers on entry application.
- 5. **Entries.** Each exhibitor may show two (2) animals in each of the single classes, but will be restricted to only one (1) entry in each group class. **ENTRIES IN THE GROUP CLASSES MUST BE MADE BY THE ENTRY CLOSING DEADLINE.**To be eligible for a group class, the animals must be entered and shown in a single class.
- 6. **Registration Verification.** Exhibitors will present registration papers for each animal entered to the Superintendents from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., Wednesday, January 22 and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Thursday, January 23. Animal information must be provided at time of entry. Substitution rule will apply to this Department. (see Rule 11, Page 19)
- 7. **Computing Ages.** While it is recognized that there is some variability in the age at which the different pairs of permanent incisor teeth first show, for the purpose of this Show (except in the case of breed association specials, when their rules will govern), the following rules will prevail.
 - (a) All breeding lambs, in order to be eligible to compete in their respective classes, must be carrying all milk teeth at the time of entering the show ring. Lambs showing either or both of the first pair of permanent incisors will not be eligible to show in any of the lamb classes. Lambs under six (6) months of age will not be eligible.
 - (b) Sheep eligible to compete in the two-tooth breeding classes must show only the first pair of permanent incisors. Sheep which have dropped their central pair of milk teeth and show one (1) or both teeth of the first permanent pair are eligible to show as singles only in the two-tooth classes of their respective breeds.
 - (c) Sheep showing the second pair of three (3) pair of permanent incisors will be eligible to show as singles in the four- to six-tooth class only.
- 8. **Heelers.** Heelers are allowed in all classes.
- 9. Shown in Fleece.

Delaine-Merino four- to six-tooth must be shorn to the skin with mechanical shears on or after March 15 of the calendar year preceding the Show leaving a uniform length of wool over the entire body.

Rambouillet must be shorn to the skin with mechanical shears on or after October 20 of the calendar year preceding the Show leaving a uniform length of wool over the entire body. Wool may not exceed two (2) inches in length. Boots may be left on Rambouillet.

Medium Wool and Hair Sheep must be shorn to the skin with mechanical shears one (1) week or less prior to showing leaving a uniform length over the entire body. Foretops and boots may be left on Medium Wool. Boots may be left on Hair Sheep.

- 10. **Points Considered.** The Rambouillet and Delaine-Merino breeding classes will be judged from a dual-purpose standpoint. Body conformation and breed characteristics will count 50 percent, and wool production will count 50 percent. Due consideration will be given to the content and quality of the fleece.
- 11. **Ownership.** Animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and must have been owned by the exhibitor prior to November 1, 2024, as evidenced by the date of transfer to the breed association.
- 12. Partnership. Both or all partners must be eligible to show in the Junior Show before an entry may show in this division.
- 13. **Open Show.** Junior exhibitors may enter the same animal in the Open and Junior Shows. However, the Junior entry and the Open entry must be submitted on separate entry applications. Only one (1) Agent Summary Sheet is needed for both entries. An additional show fee of \$40 must be paid with the Open entry. **ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED BY THE ENTRY CLOSING DEADLINE.**

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. **General Rules.** All entries in the Junior Dairy Cattle Show will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and to Special Rules of the Junior Livestock Show published in this *Premium List*, insofar as they pertain to dairy cattle.
- 2. Arrival Time. All dairy animals must be in their stalls by Noon, Saturday, January 18.
- 3. **REMINDER-Entry Verification.** Exhibitors will be responsible for obtaining and verifying their show number/entry to Superintendents at the Corral Room (in the Amon G. Carter Jr. Exhibits Hall Building) from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m., Friday, January 17 and 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., Saturday, January 18.
- 4. **Certificate of Registration.** A Certificate of Registration on each animal entered in the Junior Dairy Cattle Show must be available and must be presented to the Superintendent of the Junior Dairy Cattle Show for checking not later than 5 p.m., Saturday, January 18. Application for transfer and pending registration will not be accepted. **NO FAXED COPIES.**
- 5. **Date of Ownership.** Animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and must have been owned by the exhibitor on or before November 1, 2024, as evidenced by date of transfer, recorded date or received date by the breed association.
- 6. **Payment on Milk.** All milk produced in the milking parlor will be bought by Dairy Farmers of America which will make payment for the product to the Texas Purebred Dairy Cattle Association. The secretary of the Texas Purebred Dairy Cattle Association will make payment to individual exhibitor. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to properly identify their cows as they are milked.
- 7. **Open Show.** Junior exhibitors may enter the same animal in the Open and Junior Shows. However, the Junior entry and the Open entry must be submitted on separate entry applications. Only one (1) Agent Summary Sheet is needed for both entries. An additional cattle show fee of \$40 must be paid with the Open entry. **ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED BY THE ENTRY CLOSING DEADLINE.**
- 8. **Number of Entries.** Each exhibitor will be permitted to show as many as three (3) animals in the Junior Dairy Cattle Show, but not more than two (2) animals in any one (1) single class with the exception of championship classes.
- 9. **Dress.** Each person holding or exhibiting an animal in the arena should be dressed in white, preferably in white trousers and white shirt. Clothing worn in the arena may not bear any insignia or writing other than FFA or 4-H.
- 10. Sponsored Animals. Juniors exhibiting animals sponsored by an organization which is holding the Certificate of Registration must obtain from the sponsoring organization a photocopy of the certificate, or the certificate itself, and present it to the Superintendent for checking. In the case of photocopies, both sides of the Certificate of Registration must be photocopied and the sponsoring organization's official seal, logo or letterhead must be included.
- 11. **Judging Format.** Other Purebred and Brown Swiss cattle will be judged at 8 a.m., Tuesday, January 21 followed by Jersey. Holstein cattle will be judged at 1 p.m.
- 12. **Judging of Entries.** Entries will be judged on a dual merit basis. All entries will be grouped as follows:

Purple Ribbon Group: Score of 90 or above* ------- 5 points
Blue Ribbon Group: Score of 85 to 90------- 4 points
Red Ribbon Group: Score of 80 to 85------ 3 points
White Ribbon Group: Score of 79 or below------ 2 points

The Uniform Dairy Cattle Score Card, published by the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association, shall be used by the judge as his basis for scoring each animal. Entries in the blue ribbon group or above will be placed in numerical order in accordance with the ribbons that will be awarded by the respective breed association.

13. **Premium Award.** A maximum of \$47 per point based on the above scale of points will be paid to exhibitors in the Junior Dairy Cattle Show. Should the total premium money earned exceed the premium money allocated for the Junior Dairy Cattle Show, a readjustment of the amount paid per point will be made. **Additional points will not be allowed for numerical placing.**

^{*} Only animals which have given birth to one or more calves may receive a score of 90 or above.

- 14. Championship Classes. Only animals receiving a first premium award in their individual classes will be eligible for championship awards.
- 15. Scramble Heifers. Scramble Heifers will show in their respective class in each breed.
- 16. Junior Dairy Herd. The group is to consist of five (5) animals of the same breed, be owned by three (3) or more 4-H Club members from one (1) county or by three (3) or more FFA members from one (1) chapter, and all must have been shown in individual classes. Entries must be made by the County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher at the same time single class entries are made. No county 4-H Club and no FFA Chapter may have more than one (1) entry of the same breed in this class. Entries in Junior Dairy Herd must be made by entry closing deadline.
- 17. Fitting and Showmanship. Each junior exhibiting an animal fitted and trained by him/her in an individual class is eligible for this contest, but may compete in only one (1) Showmanship class. Final placing will be made by the official judge of the Junior Dairy Cattle Show in each of the breeds shown. Entries in the Showmanship class are not required. However, animals exhibited in the Showmanship class must also be entered in the Junior Dairy Cattle Show.

The Uniform Scoreboard for Judging Junior Fitting and Showmanship Contests as published by the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association will be used by the judge as the basis for their decision.

Exhibitors are required to bring original registration paper to the show ring while exhibiting the heifer. Placing animals will be verified for identification matching the original papers. DNA samples will be collected on Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion Heifers, as well as any other heifers designated by the Show Management. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.
- 2. Each exhibitor is entitled to enter one (1) heifer in the Junior Breeding Beef Heifer Show. A copy of the original registration certificate must be submitted with entry application.
- 3. Animals entered in this department must meet the respective breed association requirements and must be registered in the records of their respective breed association in the name of the exhibitor on or before October 31, 2024. SPECIAL RULES

- 1. To be eligible, lambs must be validated with the Texas Lamb Validation Program administered by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas Education Agency, division of Agricultural Science and Technology. The first, second and eighth place lambs in each class will be nose printed, and the print must match the nose print taken at the time of validation. Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion Lambs, as well as any other lambs designated by the Show Management, will have samples collected for DNA analysis. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.
- 2. **Upon arrival.** A representative from each County 4-H Group or FFA Chapter must obtain, from the Superintendent's Office, a packet containing their group's ear tags and weight/breed cards for their entries in this division.
- 3. **Ear Tag Numbers.** All lambs must have ear tags that match lamb's entry number at the time they are presented in the show ring. Ear tags will be provided by the Stock Show.
- 4. **Weighing.** Exhibitors will be responsible for weighing their own lambs and must return weight cards to Superintendent by 3:30 p.m., Tuesday, January 28. Any entry whose weight card is not received by this deadline will be disqualified. Texas Lamb Validation number must be included on weight card. Fine Wool, Fine Wool Cross and Medium Wool lambs weighing less than 90 lbs. will not be eligible to compete. Minimum weight on Southdown and Dorper lambs will be 80 lbs. Scales will be provided by Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show.
- 5. **Classifying.** Exhibitors must indicate on weight card the breed of each entry. All lambs will be classified at the time of judging by a three-person committee. **If the animal is classified out, it will be sifted.**
- 6. **Sale Weight.** Weight given on weight card will be the sale weight. Animals not in the sale are the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- 7. **Class Weights.** After weight cards have been returned to the Superintendent's Office, entries will be divided into weight divisions, as equal in number as possible, light, medium and heavy, for each breed. All placing lambs in each class and any lambs designated by the Superintendents will be weighed back. Any lambs not meeting minimum weight requirements, or lambs with weights more than 5 lbs. above or below the weight turned in to the Superintendents on the weight card, will be disqualified.
- 8. Shearing. All lambs must be shorn to the skin with mechanical shears one (1) week or less prior to arrival at the Show, leaving a uniform length of wool over the entire body. Boots may be left on all lambs. No electrical or battery operated clippers, blocking tables or fitting apparatus will be allowed. Hand shears may be used.
- 9. All Champions and Reserve Champions must sell.
- 10. **Number of Animals.** Each exhibitor is entitled to enter a maximum of eight (8) wether lambs in the Junior Lamb Show, but no more than two (2) will be allowed in each weight class.
- 11. **Best 10 Lambs Class.** Lambs can be any of the breeds shown. Only two (2) groups of ten (10) may be entered in the class from any one (1) 4-H Group or FFA Chapter. If it is a combined group, only two (2) groups may be shown from one (1) county. All lambs competing in the Best 10 Lambs class must have been entered and shown previously in their individual classes. Best 10 Lambs will be judged immediately following the selection of Medium Wool and Crosses Champion and Reserve Champion. Only one (1) premium check will be issued per placing.
- 12. **Ownership.** The exhibitors must have owned their lambs prior to November 1, 2024, and shall have fed and cared for their lambs exclusively during the period from ownership date to the date of the Show.
- 13. **Artificial Coloring.** No paint, powder or artificial coloring may be used on lambs.

SPECIAL RULES

- 1. To be eligible, steers must be validated with the Texas Steer Validation Program administered by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas Education Agency, division of Agricultural Science and Technology. The first and second place steers in each class, as well as any other steers designated by the Show Management, will have samples collected for DNA analysis. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.
- 2. Each exhibitor is entitled to enter only one (1) steer in the Steer Show and must have owned the steer prior to July 1, 2024. The steer must have been fed and cared for by the exhibitor from date of purchase.
- 3. **Upon Arrival.** A representative from each County 4-H Group or FFA Chapter must obtain, from the Superintendent's Office, a packet containing their group's ear tags, weight/breed cards and show numbers for their entries in this division.
- 4. **Ear Tag Numbers.** All steers must have ear tags that match steer's entry number at the time they are presented in the show ring. Ear tags will be provided by Stock Show.
- 5. REMINDER-Weighing. Exhibitors will be responsible for weighing their own steers and must return weight/breed card by 10 a.m., Wednesday, February 5 to Superintendents in the Cattle Barn 4 Meeting Room. Any entry whose weight/breed card is not received by this deadline will be disqualified. Texas Steer Validation number, breed and declared weight must be included on weight/breed card. Weight given on weight/breed card will be the official weight and used as both the show weight and the sale weight.
- 6. **REMINDER-Classifying. Steers will be classified at the time of judging by a three-person committee.** Any steer classified out of that breed division will not be allowed to declare an alternate breed and will be sifted out of the Show. After the Champion Steer of the Breed is selected, the second prize/Reserve Division Champion steer from the class/division which furnished the Champion will compete with the first prize/Division Champion steers in the other classes/divisions of this breed for Reserve Champion Steer.
- 11. All prize winning steers will be eligible for the Junior Sale of Champions, PROVIDED DESIGNATION IS MADE AS THE ANIMAL LEAVES THE JUDGING ARENA. STEERS ENTERED FOR THE AUCTION SALE WILL BE IDENTIFIED BY A JAW BRAND (F) PLACED BY A SHOW OFFICIAL IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CLASS IS JUDGED AND BEFORE THE ANIMAL LEAVES THE JUDGING ARENA. First place wether goats, as well as any other wether goats designated by the Show Management, will have samples collected for DNA analysis. In the event the DNA analysis reveals there is not a positive match, the animal will be disqualified.
- 2. **Upon Arrival.** A representative from each 4-H Group or FFA Chapter must obtain, from the Superintendent's Office, a packet containing their group's ear tags and weight cards for their entries in this division.
- 3. Ear tags will be provided by the Stock Show, and exhibitors are responsible for tagging their own animals. All goats must have ear tags that match goat's entry number at the time of Show.
- 4. **Weighing.** Exhibitors will be responsible for weighing their own goats and must return weight cards to Superintendent by 10:30 a.m., Thursday, January 30. Any entry whose weight card is not received by this deadline will be disqualified. Texas Goat Validation number must be included on weight card. Weight given on weight card will be the sale weight. Goats weighing less than 50 lbs. will be sifted.
- 5. **Class Weight.** After weight cards have been returned to the Superintendent's Office, goats will be divided into twelve (12) classes, as equal in number as possible. All placing goats in each class and any goats designated by the Superintendents will be weighed back. Any goat not meeting fifty (50) lb. minimum, or goats with weights more than four (4) lbs. above or below the weight turned in on the weight card, will be disqualified.
- 6. **Number of Animals.** Each exhibitor is entitled to enter only one (1) wether goat.
- 7. **Ownership.** The exhibitors must have owned their goats prior to November 1, 2024 and shall have fed and cared for their goats exclusively during the period from ownership date to the date of the Show.
- 8. **Showmanship Entries.** Entries in the Showmanship class are not required. However, animals exhibited in the Showmanship class must also be entered in the Junior Wether Goat Show.
- 9. All goats must be shorn to the skin with uniform clip above the knee and hock joints prior to arrival at the Show. No electric or battery operated clippers, blocking tables or fitting apparatus will be allowed. Hand shears may be used.
- 10. **Sale Animals.** The Champion, Reserve Champion, Division and Reserve Division Champion Wether Goats will be sold in the Junior Sale of Champions, Saturday, February 8 at 9 a.m. All other exhibitors desiring to sell their wether goats may do so by delivering their animals to the designated area. Wether goats will be received beginning at 2 p.m., Friday, January 31. All goats must be delivered within one hour from the conclusion of the Show. **A delivery card must be turned in to the sale personnel on each wether goat delivered.**

SPECIAL RULES

The purpose of this Show is to provide an opportunity for Texas 4-H and FFA members to display projects constructed in agricultural mechanics labs, to promote the development of skills in agricultural mechanics through competition, to recognize accomplishments in the area of agricultural mechanics and to provide an opportunity for public appreciation of this important phase of Texas 4-H and FFA Youth Programs.

All entries in this Junior Agricultural Mechanics Project Show will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and Special Rules of the Junior Livestock Show Department published in this 2025 *Premium List* and in addition, the following Special Rules.

- 1. **Eligibility.** Entries in this Show are limited to Texas 4-H and FFA members. Entries must be submitted on an official Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show 2025 Junior Agricultural Mechanics Project Entry Application sent in by the AST or CEA. Projects exhibited must have been constructed by Texas 4-H or FFA members under direct supervision of the AST or CEA.
 - a. A project may only be exhibited one (1) time at the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show. Only projects started on or after April 1, 2024 are eligible for exhibition.
 - b. Any project that does not fit into one (1) of the stated classes will be deemed ineligible and disqualified by Show Officials.
- 2. **Loss or Damage.** Every precaution will be taken to protect the projects entered; however, neither the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show, its officers, directors, superintendents nor judges of this Department will be responsible for any loss or damage to projects.
- 3. **Entries.** Projects may have been constructed by an individual or a group and may be individually or chapter/club owned. All projects must be entered in the names of the exhibitors who participated in the planning and construction of the project.
 - a. Each exhibitor may enter two (2) individual projects; no more than one (1) per class. Each group of students may enter two (2) group projects; no more than one (1) entry per class.
 - b. No exhibitor may enter more than four (4) projects total, including group projects.
 - c. A group of exhibitors shall not exceed four (4) students showing the project.
 - d. Substitution of exhibitors and projects will not be allowed.
 - e. Exhibit space and location will be at the Superintendents' discretion.
- 4. **Offloading Assistance.** If the Superintendents determine the project cannot be unloaded safely, the project will be shown on the trailer.
- 5. Showmanship.
 - a. Exhibitors should be dressed appropriately and remain with their project during judging.
 - b. Exhibitors should be courteous and helpful to those viewing their project, including those exhibiting next to them. Exhibitors should not interfere with or shield those who are exhibiting next to them.
 - c. Exhibitors should be prepared to answer questions when their project is being judged. Knowledge of the project will be evaluated at that time. Exhibitors should be well informed on the project they are representing, but should not be boisterous or argumentative.
 - d. Exhibitors should make available any equipment that may be necessary to evaluate their project (flashlights, mat or creeper, square, tape, multi-meter, etc.). Exhibitors may be requested to hold measuring tape and assist the judge in making measurements on projects.
 - e. Anonymous judges will select showmanship winners.

6. Judging Criteria.

AG MECHANICS PROJECTS - for projects in Classes 1-4, 7-10, 13-16, 19-21, 24-28.

· Presentation.

- a. All projects should be complete including finish. Any item, necessary for use of the project, must be a part of it (example: hinges and latches on gates and panels, lift pins, hydraulic hoses on tractor equipment, etc.), including documentation.
- b. All projects must be painted or properly treated and must be clean and in a presentable condition, even though they may have been used. No touch up painting of ANY type will be allowed inside the exhibit area.
- c. Due to limited exhibit space, trailers and other equipment are to be displayed in transport position. Operation of ramps, extensions and other special features may be demonstrated only as directed by the official judges and as space permits.
- d. No electricity will be available for computers or other electronic devices. An effort will be made to provide electricity for projects requiring it for operation during judging only.
- **Documentation.** An original (exhibitor drawn) plan or drawing, a bill of materials and photographs showing all phases of construction/restoration are to be provided with projects. TxDOT and/or ASABE regulations and specifications are to be provided as they apply to individual projects. Display of plans, photos, etc., must be done in such a manner that no additional floor space is required. Stands, podiums, etc., will be permitted only when no additional space is required.

Safety.

- a. **General Safety** Appropriate and safe display stands must be provided for gates, panels and other projects that need support. Sharp edges and points, such as found on self feeder roofs, bale movers, etc., are to be padded or covered as necessary to prevent injury. Flammable and/or combustible liquids and materials shall not be used, stored or sprayed inside any Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show building at any time. This shall include, but not limited to, enamel paints, thinners, reducers, gasoline or any other petroleum based liquids. All liquids must be in properly labeled original containers. All compressed gas cylinders shall be properly secured and empty. Hand wheels are to be removed. Protective caps installed and taped. No regulators or hoses are to be installed at any time.
- b. <u>Trailer Safety</u> All trailers and other equipment are to be equipped with safety equipment specified in **Title 7, Vehicles and Traffic Transportation Code of Texas Statutes**, specific chapters regarding width (621.201), lights and reflectors (545.106, 547.324 and 547.331), brakes (547.401), length (621.201) and inspection (621.204) are to be adhered to. All towed equipment, regardless of standards, is to be equipped with safety chains. All three-point hitch and power take off (PTO) operated equipment are to meet current ASABE safety and dimension standards.
- c. <u>Electrical Safety</u> All 120 VAC and higher electrical plugs and receptacles must be grounded. Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCI) shall be required for all 120 VAC receptacles. All electrical connections are to be protected in appropriate indoor or outdoor rated enclosures.
- d. <u>Projects with Engines</u> There is to be no more than five (5) gallons of fuel in any fuel tank. Fuel cap taped closed and secure against tampering. Disconnect all batteries. No vehicle and/or equipment refueling inside any building.
- Trailer Registration. Current registration plates are required on all trailers that are exhibited at the Project Show.
- **Vehicles.** Tractors, trucks or other vehicles (including non-entered trailers) are not allowed in the exhibit area as part of the display.
- Criteria Points. For Ag Mechanics Projects in Classes 1-4, 7-10, 13-16, 19-21, 24-28.

Failure to provide all required documentation and information will result in project being lowered one (1) ribbon group.

FARM AND RANCH RESTORATION PROJECTS - for projects in Classes 31-33.

- No yard tractors or riding lawn mowers.
- Exhibitors must provide mats or lumber/plywood to serve as runners to protect asphalt and concrete from damage for entries with steel lugs.
- Year model and serial number must be included with description on entry application.
- **Criteria Points.** For Farm and Ranch Restoration Projects in Classes 31-33.
 - a. Aesthetics ------ 15 Points

Overall appearance of entry including workmanship and finish will be considered.

- Preparation prior to painting.
- Painting and finish.
- Detail and completeness of components: steering wheels, seats, decals, brakes, tongues, instrument panels, wiring harness, etc.
- b. Original------10 Points

Must be as original as possible. To include:

- Finish, fasteners, decals and other components.
- Mechanical systems, fuel, electrical, engine, transmission, final drive, cooling, etc.
- Serial plates in place with unaltered serial numbers.
- c. Functional ------ 40 Points

To include the restoration of all mechanical systems.

- Engine, transmission, final drive.
- Fuel, cooling, ignition, lighting, exhaust, charging, starting, hydraulic and steering systems.

Exhibitors will be asked to start and drive the tractor; demonstrating all gears along with systems (hydraulics, lights, brakes, etc.). Driving and mechanical evaluation will be done outside when offloading.

Exhibitors may be asked to move tractors outside for additional driving and mechanical evaluation during judging.

- A Mechanical Check Sheet, used by tractor judges in the evaluation, will be posted on the website as it is available. This score sheet will include checks on systems, engine, transmission, final drive, brakes/steering, lights/safety equipment, cranking/charging and PTO/lift/hydraulics.
- Observations made when tractor is driven.
- d. Safety Equipment -----5 Points

All equipment that was original to the tractor should be in place (includes all shields and decals). Tractor must be in safe operating condition. To exhibit a tractor, the following safety considerations must be followed:

- No more than five (5) gallons of fuel in the fuel tank.
- Neat and functional drip pans containing floor absorbent material to collect any coolant, oil or hydraulics that may drip from the tractor.
- Fuel shut off valves on all fuel tanks must be functional, and all tractors must be exhibited with these valves
- An approved ABC fire extinguisher with a minimum of 5 lb. capacity must be provided and placed near the tractor.
- Tractors may be started only at the request of the Show Officials.

e. Documentation -----

The National FFA Tractor Restoration Competition documentation format may be used. Documentation must be typed and include the following:

- One page description of the overall restoration project.
- Expense report identifying all costs involved in the restoration.
- Photos (before, during and after). A safe working environment should be depicted in all photos.
- Mechanic's report detailing all mechanical work performed.

All documentation is to be arranged in a three-ring notebook, divided and sequenced with a table of contents and page numbers.

f. Knowledge------ 10 Points

Judges will ask questions to determine the exhibitor/exhibitors knowledge of and involvement in the restoration.

Showmanship includes meeting the public, eye contact, introduction, enthusiastic and articulate description of the restoration.

The Junior Ag Robotics Challenge is a challenge-based robotics contest. Some challenges will be released prior to the contest, and some will be revealed the day of the Contest. As such, teams will be required to build and program their robot prior to the Contest for the known challenges. The known challenges and full game rules will be posted at this link: https://texas4-h.tamu.edu/projects/robotics/. On the day of the Contest, additional "unknown" challenges will be revealed, and teams will be given time to further build and program to account for the new challenges.

All entries in this Junior Ag Robotics Challenge will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations and Special Rules of the Junior Livestock Show Department published in this 2025 *Premium List* and in addition, the following Special Rules.

- 1. Eligibility. Each County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher may enter four (4) teams in each Age <u>Division</u>. Entries in this division are limited to Texas 4-H and FFA members. Any contestant violating any rule will be disqualified from the Contest along with his or her team. Teams must consist of members from the same county or chapter. Three (3) to four (4) students will constitute a team in this Contest. Teams may not include members from different age divisions. Team members may only compete on one (1) team.
- 2. **Entry Applications.** Entry applications may be obtained by contacting the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show, PO Box 150, Fort Worth, Texas 76101-0150, 817-877-2400, or on our website fwssr.com.
- 3. **Entry Limitation.** Due to space limitations, only the first forty (40) Junior teams and the first forty (40) Senior teams will be accepted; **there will NOT be a waiting list**.
- 4. **Age Divisions** (as of January 1, 2025).

Junior: At least eight (8) years old and in the third grade, but no more than eighth grade.

Senior: Must be in at least the ninth grade, but not older than nineteen (19) years old and in the twelfth grade.

5. Contest Format/Rules of Play.

- a. Teams must pre-build and program a robot prior to the competition.
- b. Teams will report to the designated location for check-in and submit their robot and additional pieces/equipment for inspection.
- c. Each team will be directed to a team pit (one (1) 6' or 8' table and chairs). Each pit will have access to electricity to power laptops and robot batteries.
- d. An Orientation will be provided for all participants where Superintendents will review the challenges, rules and scoring.
- e. The design of the game and designated number of challenges will be released in advance of the Contest. There will be 3-4 additional "unknown" challenges revealed the day of the Contest during the Orientation.
- f. Each team will have 1.5 hours for additional designing, building, programming and testing of their robot.
- g. Teams will practice and compete on the same game table.
- h. If time permits, teams are allowed to make alterations to their robot design and/or program between matches.
- i. Teams must report immediately to the playing field when called.
- j. The robot must perform challenges autonomously.
- k. Only registered contestants and contest officials will be allowed in the Robot Challenge pit areas.
- I. Teams that experience equipment malfunction(s) may not replace the equipment with supplies outside the contest area (from leaders, volunteers, CEA, AST or contest officials). Instead, team members must work together and be creative in completing preparations without the malfunctioning equipment or visit with other teams to borrow the needed part.

- m. Depending on the challenges, contest officials may allow or require teams to use non-Lego items in the design of the robot. In such cases, details will be outlined in the Game Release and/or Orientation.
- n. Coaches will be permitted to meet with their team for a 10-minute time period prior to Build Time following Orientation. This time should be used to help team members develop a plan and foster positive youth development. Due to space limitations, there will not be a spectator area available until the finals.
- o. No cell phones or other types of communication devices are allowed in the pit or contest areas. Exceptions include the approved items listed in these Special Rules. During Build Time and Robot Challenge, contestants are not allowed to communicate with anyone outside of the Contest (coaches, parents, siblings, etc.).
- p. A match will range between one (1) and three (3) minutes in length, depending upon the challenges designed for competition. The specific time limit will be noted in the Game Release documents.
- q. Teams will have two (2) preliminary matches in which to earn points. The sum score of the two (2) matches plus the teamwork score will determine teams that qualify for the finals. The top five (5) teams in each age division will advance to the final match. If there are fewer than five (5) teams in an age division, no finals will take place. The total score from the preliminary matches (match + teamwork scores) will be used for preliminary placings.
- r. Finals will consist of two (2) additional matches. The two (2) match scores from the final round will be added to the total preliminary score. Finalist teams will be ranked based on their total scores. Judges' results are final.
- s. Tie-breaker procedures will be announced during the Orientation.
- t. Teams must clean up their pit areas prior to the awards ceremony. Teams not making the top five (5) are free to leave once their pit area has been cleaned and are dismissed by contest officials.
- 6. **Minimum Construction Skills and Proficiency.** Competitors must be capable of designing and building a functioning Lego® Mindstorm® robot that includes the use of:
 - a. Motors
 - b. Light/color sensor
 - c. Touch sensor
 - d. Ultrasonic sensor
 - e. Levers, arms, claws, etc.
 - f. Incorporating non-Lego® parts into robot design and/or function
- 7. **Minimum Programming Skills and Proficiency.** Competitors must be capable of programming a Lego® Mindstorm® robot in order for the robot to:
 - a. Move
 - b. Turn
 - c. Lift
 - d. Maneuver attachments effectively
 - e. Use sensors appropriately and effectively

- 8. **Equipment.** Each team must supply their own equipment for the Challenge. Each team may only bring the supplies listed in the table below. Equipment will be checked by contest officials as teams check-in for the Contest. Any extra equipment or item that does not meet specifications will be returned to the team coach. The team's robot must be fully assembled when checking in. No infrared beacons (remote) or sensors allowed.

- 9. **Bluetooth Connectivity.** Bluetooth connections can be made and utilized during Build Time. It is not allowed during the competition phase while the robot is on the playing field. No internet connectivity will be provided. Teams are advised to make sure their computer's operating system, software and robot firmware are up-to-date prior to the Contest.
- 10. **Scoring.** Point values for each separate challenge will vary depending on the level of challenge difficulty. Penalties will also depend upon challenge design, but examples may include: knocking over pieces, restricted human interaction with robot or game pieces, excessive retrievals, etc. Points will be awarded or deducted for each round of match play. Specific point values will be provided during Game Release and/or Orientation. Additionally, a teamwork score will be assessed by judges and added to the match scores to form the preliminary team score. The preliminary team score determines qualifiers for finals. After each match, the team captain will initial the score sheet, indicating agreement to the points awarded. Once signed, the match score is final and cannot be challenged. The contest tabulator will review the score sheet and correct any mathematical inaccuracies.
- 11. **Results.** The contest results, as announced, will be final.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR JUDGING CONTESTS

General Rules and Regulations for Judging Contests govern all the Judging Contests held at this Show; and in addition, each Contest will be governed by the Special Rules under that Contest. Refer to these Special Rules for eligibility of contestants, time of contest and awards. The Special Rules govern in case of a conflict with the General Rules. In addition, all Judging Contest participants must comply with the Livestock Show General Rules and Regulations as found on Page 17 of this *Premium List* publication.

- 1. Entry of Teams. Entry applications for each Judging Contest must be obtained from and filed with the General Office of the Southwestern Exposition and Livestock Show by the entry deadline for each respective Contest. This application for entry must be signed officially by the coach, certifying that the team is eligible for entry in the Contest and that each contestant is eligible under the rules of the Contest.
- 2. Superintendent. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent to see that all rules and regulations governing each Contest are duly carried out.
- 3. Judges. It will be the duty of the judges to examine the classes of livestock, to place the animals in each class and to determine the essential reasons for each placing without any assistance or consultation. Except for close observation, the judge shall make his placings of the animals at the same time the students are at work in the arena. The judges will make known their placings to the Superintendent but otherwise will not reveal their ratings until all contestants have finished giving oral reasons.

After all classes have been judged by the contestants and placed by the judges, the judges will hear and grade oral reasons on the classes on which reasons are required.

Each contestant's scan sheet will be scored against the official placings and cuts.

- 4. **Procedure of the Contests.** No one will be allowed in the arena during the Contest other than the Superintendent, his clerks and assistants, the attendants holding the animals, judges and the contestants taking part in that particular Contest. Coaches and alternates must not come in contact with the contestants during the Contest.
- 5. NO PORTABLE COMMUNICATION DEVICES MAY BE USED BY CONTESTANTS DURING COMPETITION. CONTESTANTS USING SUCH DEVICES WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY DISQUALIFIED. (Refer to General Rules and Regulations Rule 48, Page 28.)

While a Contest is in progress, there shall be no conferring between contestants or between a contestant and anyone else. except as directed by the Superintendent or a designated representative.

No contestant shall wear any uniform, school colors, or school hat, nor signify in any way to the judges personal identity or identity of the school represented.

NO CONTESTANT OR COACH WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS THE DAY PRIOR TO THE JUDGING CONTEST (with the exception of 4-H and FFA groups exhibiting animals in the Junior Division).

Contestants in each Judging Contest will meet with the Superintendent of their Contest promptly at the scheduled time and location of their respective Contest (see SCHEDULE OF JUDGING CONTESTS, Page 224). At that time. they will receive full instructions concerning the program to be followed and the manner in which the Contest will be conducted.

The contestants in each Contest will be divided into groups by the Superintendent, and a leader will be appointed for each group.

Animals within a class will be designated by numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4.

Contest classes will be selected from those livestock breeds having an economic impact on their respective industry.

Any contestant violating any of the rules and regulations applying to their Contest will be barred from competition.

6. Passes. Season ground passes, which will admit the coach and team members onto the Show Grounds, will be mailed to the coaches of the Intercollegiate Judging Contests in January. Please take care of these exhibitor grounds passes and bring them to the Show. Replacement passes must be purchased at a charge of \$40 each in the Accounting Office in Cattle 4, 4-H and FFA Judging Contest coaches will receive one-day grounds passes for their teams with their confirmation statement.

1. An undergraduate student of a senior college which offers a four-year curriculum prerequisite to a Bachelor of Science degree in Animal Science may enter. Contestants must never have taken part in any college student's senior livestock judging contest of interstate or international character prior to the calendar year in which this Contest is held. Contestants must have been in attendance as a regularly enrolled student in the institution they represent and may not have been away from the institution more than one (1) year at a time after first entering said institution, with the exception of service time in the Armed Forces. 



- 1. **Eligibility of Contestants**. Each contestant must be a student of a college in the United States or Canada. The contestant may be a student in a four-year agricultural degree college or a junior college offering agricultural training covering less than a four-year degree.
- 2. Contestants enrolled in a program of study normally requiring four (4) or more academic years for a degree must have completed at least thirty-six (36) weeks of college work. Contestants enrolled in agricultural courses as part of their course of study at schools not granting four-year degrees in agriculture must have completed at least eighteen (18) weeks of college work.
- 3. The contestant is ineligible, if they:
 - a. Have been a representative (either team member or individual) of one (1) junior college judging team which previously competed in the Southwest Dairy Cattle Judging Contest **AND** one (1) senior college judging team which previously competed in the Southwest Dairy Cattle Judging Contest. That is, a person may participate twice in the contest only if they have been a team member or individual of a junior college team, then transferred to a senior college and been a team member or individual of that team;
 - b. Have served as an official judge of dairy cattle at a fair or show;
 - c. Taught dairy judging in a college or secondary school;
 - d. Completed requirements for a college degree normally requiring at least four (4) years; or
 - e. Have been an employee or paid consultant of a breed organization, breeding service or similar unit, for which their duties include evaluation of dairy cattle for type.
- 4. If the eligibility of any student is protested, such protests must be made in writing at the arena side the day of the Contest before the Contest begins. The protest must be accompanied by a check for \$25, which will be returned if the protest is sustained. If the protest is not sustained, the \$25 protest fee shall be forfeited.
- 5. Contestants will be allowed fifteen (15) minutes to make their observations and record their placings on non-reason classes. Contestants will be allowed fifteen (15) minutes to make their observations, record their placings and take notes as will assist them in remembering the class when they appear before the judge on reasons classes. All groups will be notified two (2) minutes before time is up.
- 6. Each college may enter only one (1) team, as well as additional individual contestants.

Reasons shall be given orally before the judge or judges and, for this purpose, private rooms shall be provided. Notes may not be used when giving oral reasons.
- e. **Final Standing:** This shall be based both upon the placing and the oral reasons. Fifty (50) points shall constitute a perfect score in placing the animals, and fifty (50) points shall constitute a perfect score for oral reasons. In case of ties, contestants with the highest reasons scores in the class in which the division ties occur, will be declared the winner. If contestants are still tied after the reasons scores are used, then the lowest placing score with the highest reasons score will be used. If still tied, ties will be broken by the flip of a coin.
- f. **Group Leader:** A person shall be placed in charge of each class of horses to act as supervisor of that class, to observe the contestants, to see that the animals are properly shown and moved, and to answer any questions which do not pertain to the actual placing or instruction regarding the animals under consideration.
- g. **Judges:** Qualified judges familiar with horse judging contests will put official placings on the classes and listen to reasons.
