Supplies Needed

To start, you need:

- One Jelly Roll
- Sewing Machine--

Note the extension office has machines that can be rented for \$50 during the class time.

Other supplies you will need after 1st class

- *Coordinating Fabric
- 5/8 yard cotton fabric
- 3 1/2 yards cotton fabric

**We will discuss what this means at the first class, so if you aren't sure, please wait till then for coordinating fabrics

Other Details:

- You must be a 4-H member.
- Adults are invited to stay and assist with their youth if desired. You may be asked to assist other youth
- A Jelly Roll is a prepackaged collection of 2.5-inch fabric strips (usually about 40-44 strips).
- Places to shop-locally, Maloufs-Friona, Quilted Cowgirl- Canyon, Quilt Winks or Knotted Thread-Amarillo, Sewing Studio, Scarborough Fabrics or Sew Lubbock, in Lubbock.
