












VENUE MAP








Dairy Cow


Beef Cow







Dairy Cow

Dairy cows produce up to 5-6 gallons of milk per day

- Cows have excellent vision and keen sense of smell There are six main breeds of dairy
- · cows: Holstein, Jersey, Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, and Milking Shorthorn.

Corn

- · Corn is a fruit, vegetable, and grain!
- Corn comes in many colors like: yellow, red, purple, black, brown, and pink!
- . A cob of corn is the flower and the kernels are all of its seeds.

- Pigs don't sweat!
- . They can make 20 different sounds.
- . Female pigs are called Gilts, and Males are called Barrows.



Beef Cow

- Cows are ruminant animals with 4 compartments!
- We use many products that come from cows like: leather, shampoo, candy, and makeup!
- Texas is ranked #1 in producing the most Beef Cows in the USA!

Cotton

- Cotton was the first plant to be grown on the moon!
- . There are 50 different natural species of cotton.
- Corn is grown on every continent except Antartica.

Horse

- A female horse is called a Mare, and a Male is called a Stallion!
- Horses can sleep standing and laying down.
- They communicate through noises and body language!
