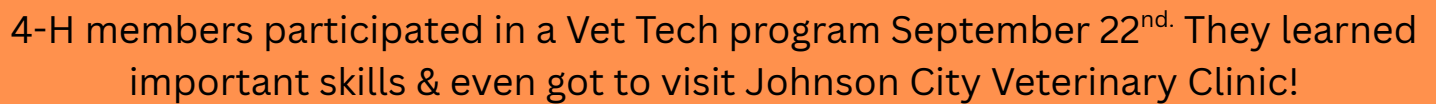

2025-2026 Texas 4-H Enrollment Guides & Instructions

Information: Please utilize the PDF resources below to help new and returning families navigate the 4HOnline system and re-enroll as soon as possible. Remember to access 4HOnline here: <https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in>

· **Youth Enrollment Fee (\$25):** Youth may participate in the 4-H year from September 1st of grade three through August 31st following completion of grade twelve, with these age restrictions:

o Minimum Age – 8 (as of September 1, 2025, in addition to being in the 3rd grade)

o Maximum Age – 18 (as of September 1, 2025)

· **Clover Enrollment Fee (\$10):** Youth who are minimum of five years old AND eligible to enroll in Kindergarten on September 1 of the current year and have not started the 3rd grade on September 1.

· **Adult Enrollment Fee (\$10):** Adults who have surpassed their 18th birthday and are no longer enrolled in school by September 1.

National 4-H Week

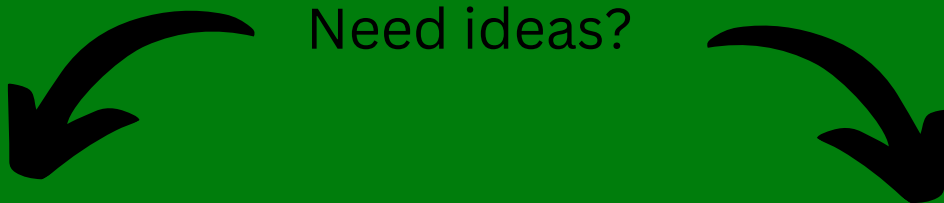
National 4-H Week is October 5–12

- Organize a neighborhood or park clean-up

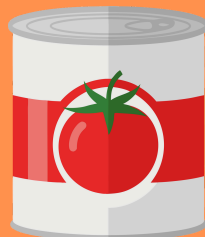

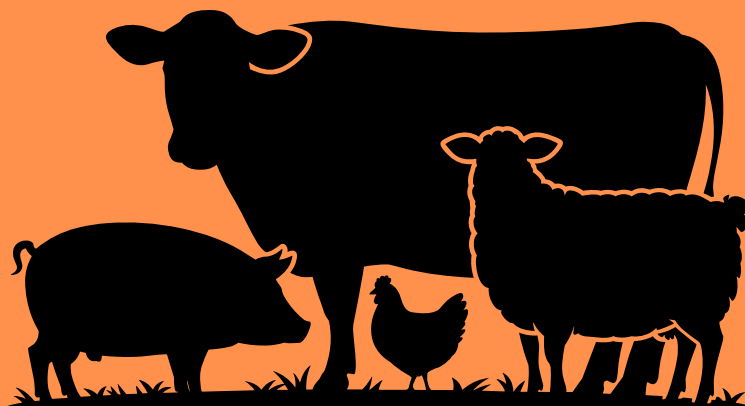
Did you know??

When you validate a livestock project for the major shows, you are agreeing to follow the Texas 4-H/FFA Livestock Program Ethics Policy. One of the most important parts of this policy is Rule #3, which requires that you, as the exhibitor (with help from your family), provide the primary daily care of your animals from the time they are validated until the end of their show eligibility.

This means feeding, housing, training, and looking after their overall health and well-being.

A key part of Rule #3 is that the address listed on your validation form should be your property (not a friend's barn or another facility). **Your animals are expected to remain at that address unless you have prior approval for them to be housed somewhere else.** There is also a new process this year for requesting those approvals, so if you know your animal may need to be moved, please contact Carley Howell right away so we can make sure the proper form is submitted. Not following Rule #3 can put your validation and eligibility at risk, so it's very important to plan ahead!
