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Dog Project

Carolyn Honish, our dog project leader, sent out a message to those who have already expressed interest. If you would like to participate in the dog project here is the instructions that she sent out:

There are a couple of task items that will need to be completed by you.

1. Mrs. Honish has created a registration form for you all to complete: <u>Dog Project Registration</u> Form Please complete this form as soon as possible.

Because of the nature of this project, we will need to meet regularly for a series of training sessions. What does that mean?

Your child will be responsible for training your dog. We will do so without the use of choke chains (metal slip lead), pinch collars, or electronic shock collars. :-)

- We will meet in early January for 5-6 weeks (once a week) for basic obedience training.
 - During this time, your child will learn about the different events that will be held at the 4-H Texas Dog Show this July (specific date & location TBD).
 - Examples: Canine Good Citizen, Conformation, Rally, Tricks, etc.
- In early March, we will meet again for 5-6 weeks (once a week) to work on specific skills related to the events in which your child will compete.
- In May, we will develop a regular schedule (meet every two weeks or so) to fine tune skills so that your child/dog are ready for the Texas Dog Show in July.
- The training schedules are TBD I'll be collecting info from the registration form on best days/times for everyone to meet. We will be training in the Hallettsville area.
- 2. All dogs participating need to go through the **Texas 4-H Dog Validation process**. **Validation must be complete by January 10th**.

Record Book Corner

This space is set aside to help you begin planning for your record book. The 4-H Record Book is not the same thing as what you turn in for a stock show entry. The 4-H Record Book contains all of the wonderful things you are doing and learning in 4-H and is an opportunity to demonstrate an understanding of record keeping while telling your 4-H story. In order to apply for awards on the county level, you must submit a record book. In Natalie's opinion, all 4-H members should complete a record book each year.

This section of the newsletter will feature record book information and will change from week to week until the entire book has been introduced.

How to Get Started:

- Put a record keeping system in place. If you are not already writing down what you do that is 4-H related –it is time you start! Get a journal, a spiral notebook, or a calendar and make it a daily habit at bedtime to write a few sentences or notes about what you did that day. Maybe you fed animals, cleaned out a pen, and attended a meeting. Make a note about how much time you spent and if you did anything community service or leadership related make sure you write it down.
- Set Goals what do you want to learn in your project. A project is not a project unless you have six new learning experiences.
- After you have completed a learning experience, jot a few notes about what you learned, what you
 would do different, how you helped others, how others helped you, and anything that made the
 experience memorable.
- Take pictures as you go the photos you put in your recordbook are used to demonstrate what you are doing/learning. Posing pictures are great for scrapbooks but your recordbook should catch you in action.

Some Basic Information for our New Members

Lavaca County 4-H is part of District 11 4-H.

There are 12 districts in Texas 4-H. District 11 4-H includes:

Austin, Washington, Fayette, Wharton, Jackson, Lavaca, DeWitt, Karnes, Bee, Refugio, Goliad, San Patricio, Nueces, Aransas, Colorado, Victoria, Calhoun, and Matagorda Counties.

In 4-H we have three age divisions: Junior 3rd-5th grade (and at least 8 years of age)

Intermediate 6th-8th grade

High School 9th-12th grade (until 19 years of age)

We have educational opportunities for Clover Kids as well. Clover Kids are in K-2.

Natalie and Shannon have adjunct faculty agreements with all of the schools in Lavaca County enabling our youth to participate in events in accordance with UIL as extracurricular activities. In order to receive an excused absence, you must have pre-approval and must meet your school's guidelines and have their approval. This process begins with your request in our office. We follow the same procedures for the private schools and homeschool, as well.

Reminder About Fundraising

Clubs and 4-H project groups are required to submit the appropriate fundraising request form in advance of doing any fundraising on behalf of their local or county group. This helps us coordinate efforts and not conflict with others. We have many, many wonderful supporters of the 4-H program in Lavaca County and we want to make sure that we do not ask the same groups/businesses/etc. over and over. Please request the fundraising form from your club manager or Natalie.knesek@ag.tamu.edu. This needs to be approved prior to any fundraising efforts.
