# Building a Resilient Herd

## Why Herd Health Matters

Maintaining a healthy herd is one of the most important responsibilities of any livestock producer. Good herd health management helps protect animal well-being, improve productivity, reduce long-term costs, and prevent the spread of disease within and between operations. Whether you manage cattle, sheep, or goats, having a proactive health plan in place can make a significant difference.

Herd health management goes beyond responding to sickness when it appears. It involves planning ahead, understanding disease risks, and using preventative tools to protect animal health. Regular observation is also critical. When producers understand what is normal for their herd, such as behavior, appetite, and movement, changes are easier to identify early, allowing for quicker intervention and better outcomes. Vaccination schedules, parasite control, and biosecurity practices all play an important role in maintaining herd health, especially as emerging threats like New World screwworm continue to be a concern.

To help local producers strengthen their herd health programs, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension will host a Herd Health Management Program on February 18. See the flyer on [page 5](#) for more details.

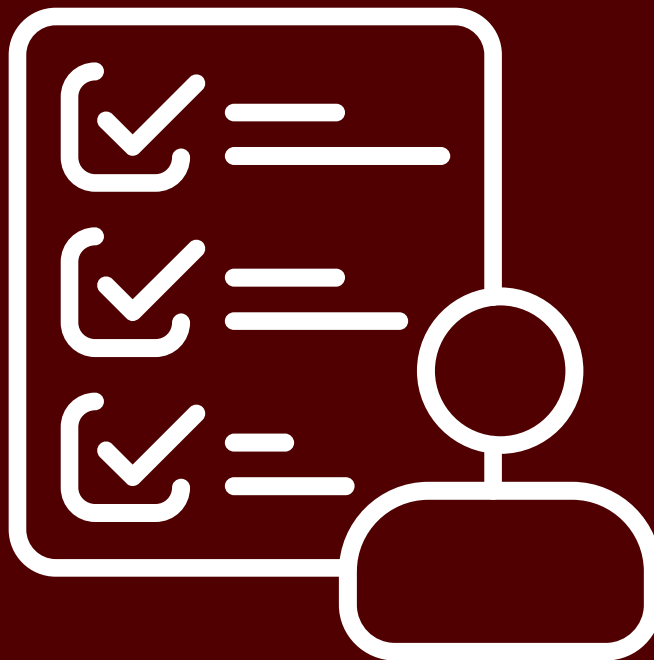


# Livestock Parasites - Producer Survey

A research team from Texas A&M University is conducting a study focused on livestock producers in Central Texas and their experiences with flies, mosquitoes, and other biting insects that can impact animal health. The project is being led by Texas A&M University undergrad and graduate students to look at producer knowledge, attitudes, and management practices related to insect pests and the diseases they may transmit. The goal of this study is to help public health and livestock professionals better support producers through improved insect monitoring, management strategies, and educational outreach. Blanco County is included as part of the Central Texas region being surveyed. They are requesting help sharing a short, anonymous, and completely voluntary survey with livestock producers. There are no right or wrong answers, and participation is optional. Your feedback would help guide future research and outreach efforts in our region.
