



The 2026 Junior Fed Beef Challenge, hosted by the Texas Cattle Feeders Association (TCFA), will be held on Friday, July 31, 2026, at West Texas A&M University in Canyon. This educational contest gives junior and senior youth the opportunity to learn more about the cattle feeding industry through hands-on evaluation of cattle performance, feeding efficiency, and carcass data. Participants compete in teams of up to three, making it a great learning experience for both new and experienced exhibitors.
